Steve Pritchard- Extension Education Educator presented to the board for approval of Summer Intern for Extension Office, Paige Wood of Fullerton. She will start June 12, 2023. Moved by Ditter and seconded by Nelson to approve Extension Office Summer Intern.

10:00 am Ben Bakewell, County Sheriff present.

Bernt gave updates on the road department. CAT Motor grader #14 that was just received back from CAT repair shop, is broke down again, it had low oil pressure. It is back at repair shop and the repairs are under warranty. CAT Motor Grader #9 is still at CAT repair shop waiting on repair. Will continue to use tractor and drag to help maintain roads until Motor graders are repaired. Looking at getting demonstration of Sany Motor Grader, so our drivers can demo. Work on 160th Project continues and making good progress. Voichoskie brought up concern of road by Krakow Church that he thought needed to be looked at. Still have an issue with street signs be stolen, working on ways to prevent this from continuing to happen. Nelson asked if a bid was looked into for a guard rail in Beaver Township, Bernt stated he would be looking at getting a bid.

Moved by Ditter and seconded by Nelson to enter Executive Session at 10:25am. Roll call: Ayes- Voichoskie, Horacek, Nelson, Juracek, Crouse, Ditter, Cornwell.; Nays-None; Absent- None. Motion carried. Executive Session held for Personnel Discussion. Move by Juracek and seconded by Horacek to conclude Executive Session and reconvene open session at 10:50 am. Ayes- Voichoskie, Horacek, Nelson, Juracek, Crouse, Ditter, Cornwell.; Nays-None; Absent- None. Motion carried.

Ben Bakewell, County Sheriff, came before board with court security changes Judge Twiss asked the county to discuss. Would like all doors to the court room, besides the front entrance to be

locked on court days, one door lock needs adjustment, clerk will look into getting it adjusted. Discussion held on metal detector for court days, Bakewell said he would look into prices and options. Discussion held on how many deputies possible needed for court days and looking into ideas for having no foot traffic down north hall by court room to judges chamber.

Bakewell, discussed with board the option to replace two of the Sheriffs pickups. Has found a car dealership with a trade in value of the two pickups at around \$31,000.00. The purchase price of the new Ford Police Package pickups would be \$50,000.00 each, with the total being after items that need to be done to the vehicles of around \$103,000.00 to \$105,000.00. There is a 3–6-month delivery time. No payment would be needed until this next fiscal year for the new budget. Moved by Nelson and seconded by Horacek to approve purchase of two Ford package pickups with trading in two vehicles that we currently have.
