The cost to maintain a minimum maintenance road is \$250/mile/year. These roads are maintained as needed, usually 2 times/year, but on an average 4 times per year. The board is considering to raising the rates for a township road to \$600/mile/year, which is what the county is currently paying Prairie Creek to maintain Prairie Creek township roads. Concerns were voiced regarding the quality of the road work. It is the intent of the foreman to schedule grader training this summer. A solution may be that there needs to be better communication between the townships and the supervisors.

Discussion was held regarding the ability of each township to control who grades their roads. Townships do <u>not</u> have to contract with the county. Prairie Creek township has their own grader and hires an employee to grade their roads. They are very satisfied with how this has worked for them.

The gravel on the township roads is the responsibility of the township and the township budget needs to allow for the cost gravel and tubes. The county does provide a 30 ft. tube for driveways to farmland per each half-mile. Gene Burton explained the budget process whereby townships can exceed budget limits to account for additional money required to put in financial resources to improve roads.

The board further explained how they decide what road, bridge, etc. gets the highest priority.

It was explained as to the differences between a supervisor and a commissioner form of county government. A possibility of combining townships was also discussed.

Mary Los, Zoning Administrator, presented road and ownership information on the minimum maintenance road in Council Creek which the Board was approached at the July 13th meeting to consider improving. Allen Small, Council Creek Chairman is present. No action is taken at this time.

Dan Stankoski, Road Foreman, gave updates on the road department. Timber Creek has chosen not to contract with Nance County for the grading of the "ranch road". Discussion was held on the financing of the new motorgrader. \$100,000.00 of the cost of the motorgrader will be financed. The amount due above \$100,000.00 will be paid on the cost. Foreman reports that he has recently met with FEMA and NEMA for funding for the snow storm and flooding. Nance County will receive some funding for the Dec. 23rd – Jan. 8th snowstorm; Nance County is eligible for funding on the March flooding of the Loup River and the June flooding

of the Beaver Creek. Paperwork has been completed and sent in for the Loup River flooding; They have now started the paperwork on the June flooding of the Beaver Creek.

The Title VI NDOR Agreement, which is a requirement to receive federal funds, was discussed with Rod Wetovick, County Attorney. The agreement needs the name of a coordinator to handle different duties to comply with said Title VI agreement. He suggested we contact neighboring counties to see if a coordinator in their county may be willing to take on the requirements for Nance County.

Ron Sims submitted bids received to install air conditioning in the food pantry/road office. The board approved said bids and approved work to begin.

County Clerk reports that the preliminary tax levy requests have been received. The County will allow .0325 tax allocation for the fire districts, and the Ag Society will be allowed their request for \$31,250.00 for general fund and \$15,600.00 for the capital improvements. The county will have zero authority for the townships.

The Board reviewed and approved the Sheriff's Distress Warrant Report. The report stated that a total of \$6,295,15 plus interest of \$157.02 was collected from Distress Warrants #2008-00001 through #2008-00016. The board reviewed and approved the report from the Nance County Treasurer itemizing the amount of uncancelled personal property taxes as shown by distress warrants returned by the Nance County Sheriff. It is reported that all warrants were collected in full for a total collection of \$6,452.17.

The Board further discussed claim #01007224, which was tabled at the July 27th meeting. It was decided that the county reimbursement of medical claims over the \$750.00 employee portion will be paid only on claims between January and December for the current year. The claim will be submitted for payment at the next meeting.

Dan Stankoski, road foreman, came before the board with road updates. Received settlement offer from insurance company for damage to excavator in the amount of \$86,266.67. Discussion was held on whether or not to accept the offer. Stankoski will contact NIRMA to see if they would raise the offer due to the fact that the excavator had brand new tires installed. Board decided that if NIRMA would not raise the offer because of the new tires, they would accept the offer of \$86,266.67. Stankoski is waiting for bids from Gary Smith on asphalt projects. Road maintenance agreements received from all townships except South Branch. They will be contacted again. Stankoski was quoted a bid for a new CAT excavator. Rusty Rogers with NE Machinery was present to answer questions. With the insurance settlement, a new excavator with a 5 year extended warranty would cost \$112,477.00. Keith Gilmore with Gilmore and Associates came before the board to answer questions regarding engineering services they provide.

A letter was received from the Northeast Nebraska Area Agency on Aging, informing the board that they have received the nomination of Norm Frerichs to represent Nance County on the Advisory Board for a 3 year term and asked for a confirmation letter of appointment from the board. Moved by Ditter and seconded by Voichoskie to confirm the appointment of Norm Frerichs to the Northeast NE Area Agency on Aging Advisory Board to represent Nance County for a three year term. Mary Los approached the Board regarding the contribution voted on in June, 2010 for Jenna Malander on a matching grant even though the matching grant was denied by the rural health. She reported that the development agency had voted on contributing \$1,000.00 on the same matching grant and has decided to stick with their contribution. Discussion was held. Moved by Small and seconded by Knopik to make the \$2,000.00 contribution for Jenna Malander for 3 years, without the rural health matching grant, payable beginning June 1, 2011 with the condition that Ms. Malander continue her employment in Nance County for the three years. Dan Stankoski reported to the board that he had contacted NIRMA regarding raising the settlement offer due to the fact that the excavator had new tires at the time it burned up and he received a new offer of \$90,000.00 less the \$500.00 deductible. The board will accept the \$89,500.00 settlement offer.

Board recessed for lunch.
