A meeting of the County Board of Supervisors of Nance County, Nebraska was convened in open and public session on January 14, 2014 in the Supervisor's Room, Nance County Courthouse, Fullerton, Nebraska.

Chairman, Dennis Jarecke, called the meeting to order at 9:30 a.m. with the following members present-Jarecke, Ditter, Voichoskie, Peterson, Lani, Jones, Horacek. Also present is County Clerk, Danette Zarek. Chairman advised those present of the open meetings act and its posting in the Supervisor's Room.

Notice of the meeting was given thereof by publication in the Nance County Journal on January 8, 2014.

Notice of the meeting was given to the Board and a receipt of their acknowledgment is on file in the Clerk's office.

Moved by Ditter and seconded by Lani to approve the agenda. Roll Call: AYES–Ditter, Voichoskie, Peterson, Lani, Jones, Horacek, Jarecke; NAYS–None. Motion carried.

Moved by Lani and seconded by Ditter to amend the minutes of the December 19, 2013 meeting to correct the resolution # of the Salary resolution from #13-24 to #13-25 and correct the salary amount for the Sheriff and County Attorney from \$49,500.00 to \$49,450.00 commencing January, 2015. It was questioned as to whether, since the county attorney's salary was increased, did the board intend to make his position full-time. Discussion held. It being the intention of the board that the office of the county attorney remain a part-time position, roll call taken on the motion made and seconded. The County Clerk acting as chairperson called the meeting to order with the first order of business being the selection of the Chairman and Vice-Chairman of the Board for 2014. Selection process used was secret ballot. Chairman vote was as follows: Jarecke-6, Horacek-1. Jarecke was declared Chairman. Vice-Chairman vote was as follows: Ditter-5, Horacek-1, Voichoskie-1. Ditter was declared Vice-Chairman.

The meeting was turned over to Chairman Jarecke.

Moved by Ditter and seconded by Lani to reappoint Dan Stankoski as Highway Superintendent for 2014. Roll Call: AYES-Ditter, Voichoskie, Peterson, Lani, Jones, Horacek, Jarecke; NAYS-None. Motion carried.

Dan Stankoski, Highway Superintendent, gave road updates to the Board. He reports that NIRMA approved a grant from the 2013 Assist campaign to pay for one-half of the cost (\$375.00) of the tommylift that the Road department purchased. Discussion held on new bucket/thumb for the excavator. The weight of the bucket/thumb is over half of the weight capacity for the excavator. Road department will go tomorrow to pick up the excavator with bucket and thumb and operator will need to work with the bucket and get the feel for weight limits. Discussion held on a minimum maintenance road that has been fenced off by landowner. Public safety was discussed. County attorney will send letters to both the landowner and the township board, and the landowner will be given time to take down the fence to open the road back up. Stankoski reported the department is taking down large trees on N. 480th for project C63(114); working on the 1 & 6 year plan and would like to hold the hearing at the February 11th meeting; Boone County is hosting a 2-day motorgrader seminar and have invited Nance County road department to attend; Discussion held on hiring an assistant road foreman. Stankoski will move forward with this. It was suggested to sell the scraper as it has not been used in the last two years. Stankoski feels that a bobcat would be more valuable to the department than the scraper.

11:00 Voichoskie excused.

Discussion held on whether the insurance incentive offered by the county was legal. There was some confusion as to counties not legally being able to offer employees the incentive if they were double covered on health insurance. A letter from Larry Dix, NACO Executive Director, was reviewed by the board. It appears that the incentive payments are legal if handled correctly and Nance County is correctly monitoring the incentive payments, following all rules/regulations.

Board discussed reviewing the current Nance County personnel policy. Jarecke and Horacek are on the personnel policy review. Clerk will work with the officials and set up a date and time to meet to discuss the updates needed.

Clerk made the board aware of the Federal Fiscal Year 2011 Incentive payment that the county will be receiving shortly. The amount of the payment Nance County will receive is \$4,680.00.

Discussion was held on the time sheets being kept by the Economic Development/Zoning department. All other employees are turning in time sheets to their supervisors and if they have no supervisor, the time sheets are being turned into the clerk's office. Board agrees that the Economic Development/Zoning department should be turning in time sheets, showing balances of vacation, sick and comp time, to the clerk's office at the end of each month.

Clerk reminded the board that the 2014 County Board Workshop is being held February 5-7, 2014. Need to get registered if planning to attend. Agenda will be provided to board members; three 'hazard identification' public meetings scheduled by Lower Platte North NRD are scheduled. Officials are invited to attend; Wellness Partners, LLC has requested to hold an on-site screening for county employees at no cost to employees. Employees taking part in the screening would receive a personalized wellness report. Board does not have any objections to the screening.

Mark Johnson, with TransCanada pipeline came before the board to introduce himself. He answered questions from the board.

Mary Baldridge, Zoning administrator, came before the board for zoning board member appointments. Appointments are up for Dennis McCoig, Lynn Belitz and Brett Houtby. Moved by Peterson and seconded by Jones to re-appoint Dennis McCoig, Lynn Belitz and Brett Houtby for 3-year terms. Roll Call: AYES—Peterson, Jones, Horacek, Ditter, Voichoskie, Jarecke; NAYS—None; ABSENT-Lani. Motion carried. Baldridge has run a notice in paper explaining what the zoning regulations are meant to accomplish. She enumerated to the board the reasons for the 83' road setbacks. They are: 1) to ensure the right-of-way is protected for future utility easements; 2) to ensure room for road/shoulder widening; 3) for accidental reasons, preventing additional bodily injury if someone runs off the roadway and into a nearby structure; 4) trees/buildings have an effect of creating a snowfence.

Dan Stankoski. Road foreman, gave updates in the road department: Randy Brown with CAT is present and explains the affect of the CAT store closing in Columbus as of January 31, 2014. Stankoski has set up a valuation with Lee Daniels with Nebr. Machinery Co. on the dirt scraper and track loader. Brian McDonald has deck plan done for bridge #11505P on N. Clover Road. Would like to get bids going for a completion in early spring. County Attorney reports that he has written letters to each of the township board members regarding the fenced off minimum maintenance road discussed at prior meeting. He has not heard back from any of the board members. Stankoski states he has placed fencing notices in local papers since the last meeting for this reason. Stankoski presented the weights of the excavator bucket, the shredder attachment and the weight of the concrete bucket they are looking at purchasing. There was a concern as to the weight of the concrete bucket, but in comparison there is not much difference in weight. Moved by Horacek and



seconded by Ditter to purchase the 42" bucket for the excavator. Roll Call: AYES-Horacek, Ditter, Voichoskie, Peterson, Jones, Jarecke; NAYS-None; ABSENT-Lani. Motion carried. Stankoski has talked to Duane Goelz and he has agreed to move over to rebuilding roads this summer. An ad will be run for a road employee to replace Goelz in his area. Paint on the box of the new dump truck has been peeling off. He reports that the truck will be repainted without cost to the County. Stankoski has received state bids on trucks and has ordered a Ford F150, w/8' box, auto transmission for \$23,469.00. It should be ready in 8-10 weeks.

The Board reviewed and approved the Monthly Fee reports of the County Clerk in the amount of \$3,375.86; Clerk of the District Court in the amount of \$245.08; and County Sheriff in the amount of \$4,006.55.

9:25 a.m. County Attorney present.

Mary Baldridge, Zoning/Economic Development Administrator comes before the board with an estimate of property taxes that Nance County could expect to receive from the pipeline. 2015 estimated property taxes are \$460,540.00. Mark Johnson with Keystone XL is also present. He informed the board that he expects the 2015 property tax will be almost double that (\$925,000.00). He will do more looking into it.

Rod Wetovick came before the board for an extension of his conditional use permit for paunch composting. Samples of the paunch and composting were available for the board to examine. Discussion held. Moved by Jones and seconded by Horacek to extend the CUP for paunch composting for Rod Wetovick as long as no complaints are received. Roll Call: AYES-Jones, Horacek, Ditter, Voichoskie, Peterson, Lani, Jarecke; NAYS-None. Motion carried.

10:20 a.m. Chairman opens the One & Six Year Road Plan hearing. Dan Stankoski, Highway Superintendent, is present. Stankoski provided copies of the one & six year map to the board and went through each project separately. There are 12 projects on the one year plan and 9 projects on the six year plan. Stankoski reports that the minimum maintenance road in western part of county remains fenced off by landowner. County Attorney may need to take action. It was suggested at the last meeting to sell the dirt scraper as it has not been used in the last two years. Eddie Bomar with NE Machinery Company is present. He provided a \$6,500.00 trade in value on the dirt scraper. For that price, the board decided to hang on to the scraper. He also put a \$11,375.00 trade-in value on the 943 crawler loader and a \$65,000.00 trade-in value on the 1997 CAT 140H motorgrader. Board discussed putting this motorgrader back on the Belgrade route and using the Belgrade machine for dirt work this summer, but it is 17 years old and has 24,500 hours on it. Board discussed an easement requested by Kathleen Nelson to lay a water line under N 140th Ave. between SE½ of Sec. 22-16-8 and SW½ Sec. 23-16-8, Nance County. SuAnn Engel reported on the NACO insurance meeting she attended. NACO is now offering health insurance through Coopertunity, United Healthcare, Coverntry as well as Blue Cross/Blue Shield. If the county would choose to go back to the NACO insurance, we would have to contract in mid-year. They also talked about the insurance incentive being offered for those employees who are double covered. They said it should be called a cash out plan instead of an insurance incentive. It was also stated at the meeting that we can offer a cash out plan to employees eligible for Medicare as long as it is through the cafeteria plan. Engel checked with our cafeteria plan provider, First Concord, and they are making changes to the enrollment form to fit this option. Also the First Concord is offering a different option for the cafeteria plan. The cafeteria plan runs from July 1 through June 30. At the present you have the full year to put money into the plan. At the end of the year, June 30, you have 60 days to accrue expenses and 90 days to collect on the expenses. Whatever is remaining in your plan is lost. With the new option, you can roll over \$500.00 at the end of the year, June 30. Engel discussed the new option with employees and most, if not all favored the new option. Discussion held. Moved by Voichoskie and seconded by Lani to switch to the \$500.00 roll over cafeteria option. Roll Call: AYES-Voichoskie, Peterson, Lani, Jones, Horacek, Ditter, Jarecke; NAYS-None; Motion carried.

(\$167.00 more than previous year) There are currently 306 veterans in Nance County. The





Nance County Veteran Service committee met this morning and they agreed that a request should be made to increase county's budget for the Veteran's Service Office Fund by \$500.00. Board assured Mr. Shuda that it will be considered when preparing the 2014-2015 budget document.

Dan Stankoski, County Highway Superintendent is present. Stankoski advised the board that Rich Braal started his employment with the County on May 1, 2014 and Ron Borgheiinck started May 12, 2014.

Stankoski contacted two appraisers regarding determination of land value of land needed to be purchased for project C63-114. Doug Stejskal will put in a bid for the project.

Clerk received paperwork on Fullerton SW Box Culvert. Moved by Ditter and seconded by Peterson to authorized Chairman to sign Notice of Award to WAW Construction, Inc., Agreement between County and WAW Construction, Inc., and Notice to Proceed. Discussion held on bridge #12110P on N 205th Ave. West of Belgrade. Ambrose Placzek with Midwest Sales and Service is present. Last year the north side of the bridge was repaired. The South side is now in need of repairs as the back wall and wings are starting to cave in. Placzek gave the board two separate estimates – cost of new pilings/sheeting/longer wings/erection-\$27,726.00 or if the pilings were not replaced – cost of sheeting/longer wings/erection-\$19,660.00. The pilings are still okay, but they were not placed deep enough and could cause problems down the road. Board approved the cost to go with the higher estimate and replace the pilings. Ed Hoevet could have the work done before July.

Stankoski reports that re-decking on C006311505P is near completion. Pictures were passed around.

Eddie Bomar, CAT representative is present with paperwork for purchase of the CAT 12M2. Papers were signed.

Bill Loeske comes before the board to discuss the smell connected with the Soil Builder I/Soil Builder II that has been spread on Rod Wetovick's farm ground. There is a meeting set up with the planning & zoning regarding this. No action taken by the board. Loeske additionally requested that the board look into a fence owned by Wetovick next to a road. He feels the fence is too close to the road. Rod responded stating that the fences are in the same place as they were at the time his father purchased the real estate. The board suggested that the County surveyor be asked to do a survey of the property.

Jones questioned Stankoski on the driveway tube requested and discussed at a prior meeting. Stankoski has requested that Dan Theis prepare a drainage study for an estimate of the culvert size.

Neva Umstead came before the board to discuss the Nance Trans. She informed the board she is wanting to apply for a grant for two additional vehicles. She would like to station one of the vehicles in Genoa to allow them more access to the Nance Trans. She requested a letter of support from the board for the grants.

Board agrees to supply a letter of support. She states she continues to make requests from the cities for funds for the support of the Nance Trans. She would appreciate it if the board would continue to support the Nance Trans through the County Budget.

Mary Baldridge, Economic Development Administrator, informed the board of information she has gathered regarding the Fullerton FSA office. She learned that due to a national hiring freeze, when people at FSA locations retire or move on to other jobs, they are not replaced. Recently two employees left the FSA office and without a full-time manager they were unable to sustain a full-service office in Fullerton and decided to consolidate Fullerton with Central City. Another factor taken into account when consolidating is other agrelated services offered in the communities. Central City has John Deere, Case and other dealers in their community. Baldridge spoke to Neil Moseman, Ag & Energy Policy Director for Senator Deb Fischer. It was suggested by Moseman to Baldridge that letters/petitions from local citizens certainly couldn't hurt the situation. The board asked Baldridge to draft a letter to the FSA on behalf of the county and they will sign it. It was also



suggested that Dennis Jarecke prepare a Letter to the Editor urging citizens to write and voice their concerns as well.

Discussion regarding the designation of a Livestock Friendly County was held. Even though the county considers themselves as a livestock friendly county, if we don't apply and receive the designation, and other counties do, it makes us look like we aren't livestock friendly. Baldridge will have more on this in the next couple of meetings.

The County received a letter from Bob Wilhelm, project manager of the FirstNet/State and Local Implementation Grant Program, requesting counties to appoint a representative to speak with FirstNet about the county's current communications situation. Once a design to build the network is complete they will deliver their proposed plan to the Governor who will decide if Nebraska will accept the plan. Dan Stankoski, highway superintendent, gave road updates. Paperwork for Wolbach NE Box Culvert #63-191 received from JEO was discussed, including Recommendation of Acceptance and attachments: Change Order No. 1 and Application for Payment 2 (Final). Change Order No. 1 decreased amount of contract price by \$3,520.00 due to decrease of corrugated metal pipe and silt fence materials being needed for the project. Moved by Peterson and seconded by Lani to sign the Recommendation of Acceptance and attachments. Roll Call: AYES-Peterson, Lani, Jones, Ditter, Voichoskie, Jarecke; NAYS-None; ABSENT-Horacek. Motion carried. 2001 Mac Truck lost a chunk of metal off the engine. The engine has 372,000 miles on it. He questioned the board as to whether they would like to replace the engine or replace the truck. He received 3 bids to replace the engine being: \$24,959 from Hradec Diesel in Norfolk; \$32,099.66 from Express Truck in Columbus; and \$24,781.30 from Tri County Truck Repair in Columbus. Board would like to get the engine replaced. Stankoski will check with the two lowest bids, and choose whoever can get to the repairs the soonest, and see if they loan out a vehicle to use during the repair. Stankoski reports that Jerry Westring (WAW) will begin the bridge work on the Valley Road C63-(199) tomorrow. Bids were received on a broom for





the bobcat the county is leasing from Kaytons. Bid received from Kayton International for \$5,350.00; and a bid received from Bobcat in Grand Island for \$3,892.77 (which includes a \$1,993.68 municipal discount). Board felt purchasing a broom for the bobcat would make more sense than purchasing a cab for the lawn mower, as it could be used for light snow removal around the courthouse as well as cleaning bridges by the road department. Moved by Ditter and seconded by Voichoskie to purchase a broom for the bobcat in lieu of purchasing a cab for the lawn mower. Roll Call: AYES–Ditter, Voichoskie, Peterson, Lani, Jones, Jarecke; NAYS-None; ABSENT-Horacek. Motion carried. Board suggested contacting Kayton regarding a discount. If discount is offered, order from Kayton International. The County has been contacted by the Nance County Fair Board regarding the road department doing dirt work for the demolition derby to be held at the fair. Road department has done this in the past and no one has any objection to helping out again this year.

Grant Miller, county surveyor, reported on findings regarding surveying of a road and fence that Bill Loseke had requested the Board look into. Miller has spent considerable time and county money on the surveying and will need additional time to finish up the complete survey. He questioned whether the county wants to continue with the survey or he suggested using the center of the road and measuring 33' to each side of the center of the road for fencing purposes. The Board is not interested in continuing with the cost of a survey for this or any other future fencing disputes and they agree to use center of road and measure 33' to each side for this dispute.

Mary Baldridge, Zoning Administrator, reported on additional information she had found regarding livestock friendly counties (LFC). Also present is Jim Knopik, John Small, Bob Small and Joe Held. There are currently 26 counties in Nebraska with the designation of Livestock Friendly through the State. Four counties have adopted Resolutions declaring themselves as being an LFC, and four counties have said "No" to the State LFC designation. Remaining Counties are unknown as to livestock friendly status. Baldridge listed "pros" and "cons". Knopik stated that he would really hate to see Nance County give up their zoning regulations. He feels that the reason some counties have gone to the State designation of the LFC may be that they don't have the kind of zoning board and local people showing up to run the zoning as we do in Nance County. Letting someone else take over is easier for them. He doesn't know why we would give up our zoning and make it weaker, allowing a large corporation to come in and set up a large animal unit within three quarters of a mile from someone's farmstead. This is the main reason zoning was set up in the first place. Ditter states that he sees no advantage to becoming state-designated livestock friendly-county. Baldridge will compile today's information with past information for them to consider when making a decision.

A Continuation of Service Agreement for TRANE heating/cooling system was presented to the board. The cost of the agreement is \$2,280.00 for one year. Moved by Ditter and seconded by Peterson to sign TRANE service agreement. Roll Call: AYES-Ditter, Voichoskie, Peterson, Lani, Jones, Jarecke; NAYS-None. ABSENT-Horacek. Motion carried.

Chairman opened the public hearing on the Monte Walker Conditional Use Permit (CUP). Baldridge informs the board that the planning and zoning committee recommended the approval of the CUP with the following conditions, which both Monte Walker and Joe Held, neighboring landowner, have agreed to: 1) entrance to the campground must be via Walker's gate or the county road; 2) Walker must maintain liability insurance; 3) Guests of the campground may not trespass on neighboring land and waterways; 4) There may be no more than 25 ATVs on-site at any given time; 5) Garbage service must be established and maintained with a local collection company; 6) Human waste must be taken off-site, not disposed of on Walker's land; 7) Vehicles/campers may not be left at the site during the off season; 8) The campground shall be open between Memorial Day and Labor Day. Guests must remove all vehicles from the site within a week following Labor Day; 9) This is an annual permit and must be renewed every year; and 10) Walker must present a copy of the Campground Covenants to the zoning administrator. Walker intends to keep this a family friendly site not a "party-site". Discussion held. Moved by Lani and seconded by Voichoskie to approve the Conditional Use Permit with conditions set out above. Roll Call: AYES-Lani, Jones, Ditter, Voichoskie, Peterson, Jarecke; NAYS-None; ABSENT-Horacek. Motion carried.

Public hearing on review of CUP for Robert Voichoskie. Voichoskie has agreed to stop receiving the product, but requested that he be allowed to finish spreading what he has on site. Planning and zoning committee recommended the approval of the revocation of the CUP with the condition that Voichoskie be allowed to finish spreading the remainder of the product he currently has on site. Discussion held. Moved by Ditter and seconded by Peterson to approve the revocation of the CUP with conditions as stated above. Roll



Call: AYES-Ditter, Peterson, Lani, Jarecke; NAYS-None; ABSTAIN-Voichoskie, Jones; ABSENT-Horacek. Motion carried.

Public hearing on review of CUPs for Rod Wetovick. Baldridge informs the board that the planning and zoning committee has tabled their decision on the CUPs until July 21, 2014. The conditions set in Merrick County for spreading of the commercial biodegradable waste was explained. Permits are valid for 3 months, but can be extended; each landowner is allowed one permit at a time-no multiple permits; applications are allowed once every 3 years; exact mapping must accompany the application; cannot be spread within 1,000 feet of a farmstead; stockpiling is allowed for 45 days-to be spread within 48 hours. A decision is tabled until a decision is made by the planning and zoning committee.

Subgrant Agreements between The Nebraska Department of Health and Human Services Division of Children and Family Services Child Support Enforcement and Nance County Clerk of District Court and the Nance County Attorney for reimbursement of expenses related to child support enforcement administration by the Ex-officio Clerk of the District Court and the Nance County Attorney was presented to the board. Short discussion held. Moved by Lani and seconded by Voichoskie to sign said agreement for District Court Clerk. Roll Call: AYES-Lani, Jones, Ditter, Voichoskie, Peterson, Jarecke; NAYS-None; ABSENT-Horacek. Roll Call: Moved by Voichoskie and seconded by Jones to sign said agreement for County Attorney. Roll Call: AYES-Voichoskie, Peterson, Lani, Jones, Ditter, Jarecke; NAYS-None. ABSENT-Horacek. Motion carried.

Rodney Wetovick, County Attorney, made the board aware that he had signed a renewal for the Stop Program and Traffic Safety Plus Program. Programs allow a 4-hour class for minor traffic offenses, with a \$138.00 fee payable by the individual, of which the County receives \$25.00. The funds collected are used by the Sheriff's department to buy equipment. The cages for the sheriff's vehicles were purchased with these funds.

Also present is County Clerk, Danette Zarek. Chairman advised those present of the open meetings act and its posting in the Supervisor's Room.

Notice of the meeting was given to the Board and a receipt of their acknowledgment is on file in the Clerk's office.

The Pledge of Allegiance is recited.

Moved by Ditter and seconded by Voichoskie to approve the agenda. Roll Call: AYES-Ditter, Voichoskie, Peterson, Jones, Horacek, Jarecke; NAYS-None; ABSENT-Lani. Motion carried.

Moved by Voichoskie and seconded by Peterson to approve the minutes of the June 24, 2014 meeting. Roll Call: AYES–Voichoskie, Peterson, Jones, Horacek, Ditter, Jarecke; NAYS-None; ABSENT-Lani. Motion carried.

Moved by Ditter and seconded by Peterson to approve all claims submitted. Roll Call: AYES–Ditter, Voichoskie, Peterson, Jones, Horacek, Jarecke; NAYS-None; ABSENT-Lani. Motion carried.

Dan Stankoski, County Highway Superintendent, gave updates for the Road department: Request received by Thad Russell for a driveway tube. They will install an 18" flat bottom/30' long tube. Jim Kramer, City Administrator, has been contacted regarding including one city street block with the asphalting of N535th St. (Sale Barn Road). Kramer said he will put it on the agenda for the city council to discuss. Should have an answer by next board meeting. If the city agrees to reasphalt, Stankoski suggested signing an interlocal agreement with the City. Bottom of box culvert on Valley Road is being poured. Walls should be poured Monday or Tuesday and department could be backfilling the box a week from this Friday. Department is working on the ditch on project 63-191 on N 485th St. Discussion held on crowns in the county roads. Board would like to keep a watch on these so they do not get too much crown. Roads by Darwin Homolka and Lloyd Johnson properties have been rebuilt. 2001 Mack Truck was taken to Hradec Diesel in Norfolk. Their bid was slightly higher than Tri County Truck Repair, but they also had a better warranty. The truck should be ready in a little over a week. Bids were reviewed for a fence around the county yard. Board suggested that Stankoski get a couple more bids.

Genoa Economic Development members, Gary Juracek, Ike Anderson and Dennis Dannelly came before the board. They reported on properties they bought and resold in the Genoa community. A lot of good has come of those properties. They also voiced their appreciation for the county's support.

Mary Baldridge, Economic Development/Zoning Administrator, is present for discussion on livestock friendly county (LFC) designation. Also present is Jim Knopik. Jarecke states that he feels the county should go through the state to obtain the LFC designation. Voichoskie, Horacek and Ditter question what the county would gain by the state designation. Baldridge states that the county would gain: signs with the State logo, listings in the Department of Agriculture's trade literature, and a ribbon cutting with the governor. Knopik feels the State would force the county to change their setbacks, even though Baldridge was told by the Department of Agriculture that the state would not force the county to change setbacks. Other counties who have considered becoming livestock friendly are suspicious. Some counties argue that it could be possible that if a county would obtain the livestock friendly designation through the State, and down the road they would deny



an applicant, based on the county setbacks, the applicant could sue the county on the grounds that they are a state designated LFC, but are not following the Department of Ag regulations. It is noted that if the county did apply and receive the state LFC designation, they would not have to keep the designation, they could get out at any time. Jarecke adds that Merrick County holds a state designated LFC and as a result of the designation, they have not had an influx of outside producers come into the County, it's all local producers. Counties that Baldridge has talked to after becoming state designated LFC, stated that they have not had any new LFC come into the county as a result of the designation. Knopik adds that with the increase in markets, people looking to expand will look to the least resistant counties. He would rather see the county go with a self-designation, such as Madison has done. Board tables any decision on the matter at this time. Board approved a letter that Baldridge prepared regarding the Farm Service Agency office to be mailed out to senators, congress, Farm Bureau and others. Baldridge submitted her activities report for both the Economic Development and Zoning for the period of March 5, 2014-July 1, 2014. The preparation of a grant for a "working dog" for the sheriff's office is discussed. It is noted that the sheriff's office would be allowed to keep 80% of any drug money seized from arrests made through the aid of the drug dog and use it within the sheriff's department.

Tom Smith, Emergency Manager, came before the board to request applying for a credit card to be used for fuel and supplies. The credit card to be applied for is recommended by NACO. Board agrees to allow Smith to apply for said credit card. Smith is looking into grants through the DEQ, available in September and in January, for collection of hazardous materials. Smith reports that Boone County LEOP is completed and the State is reviewing. Nance County LEOP is next. He will get it on the agenda for August to discuss.

SuAnn Engel, Deputy Clerk, presented the board with a copy of a balanced budget summary page. Discussion held on cash reserve, transfers, questions and concerns.

There are 3 trees hanging over the road on S. 350th Ave. Although the trees are not in the county right of way, they are deteriorating and when they fall they are going to fall on the roadway. Board agrees that the trees should be removed. Trees will be removed on Friday. Cost will be \$700.00.

Dan Horn came before the board to discuss the drainage on the new box culvert on the Valley Road. He does not feel that there is enough right of way on each side of the bridge and water will be diverted onto his land. Brian McDonald and several board members have been out to the bridge site and McDonald does not feel that the water drainage will cause any problems, but he gave the board several options, one of which would be to place a 15" culvert in the wing wall to allow drainage. Other options were discussed. Board will make a decision later in meeting when they have a chance to discuss it with McDonald. Horn further requested that the trees piled up on his property be removed or burned. Road department will burn the trees. Also fence was removed for the project. Baldridge additionally informed the board that she has distributed petitions around the county that residents are urged to sign. Petitions are objecting to the reduction of service days at the Fullerton FSA office and imploring lawmakers to find another way to address budget cuts. It was suggested that an ad be placed in the newspaper making residents aware that the petitions are out there, if they are interested in signing. Board received a copy of a letter written by Senator Dubas to the NE State Farm Service Agency voicing her concerns with the FSA office hour reduction.

Further discussion on options for Valley Road box culvert held. McDonald is on the phone. McDonald advised the board that he did not feel anything needed to be done on the project, but agreed that if the board felt it necessary to do something, the option of placing a tube in the wing wall would work. Vice-Chairman asked the opinion of each board member and a majority of the board voted to place a tube in the wing wall. Stankoski will set up the work. Jones will advise Horn of the decision.

The awarding of the bid on the resurfacing of N535th St. (Sale Barn Road) is tabled to the next meeting.

Dave Moore, County Sheriff, and Platte Valley Communications employees, Ed Meedel and Eric Munz came before the board regarding mobile radio system. The radio coverage for the county is very poor. Mr. Meedel made an inspection of the sites where repeaters are located. He presented a cost estimate to bring the service up to optimum performance levels. Estimated cost is \$25,000.00. Discussion held. Moved by Lani and seconded by Horacek to approve the work on the county land mobile radio system to improve the radio coverage. Roll Call: AYES-Lani, Jones, Horacek, Voichoskie, Peterson, Ditter; NAYS-None; ABSENT-Jarecke. Motion carried. Lani suggested that the sheriff's office additionally look to NIRMA or TransCanada for help with payment of the work.

12:10 p.m. Horacek excused.

Jeff Rauh with TransCanada Keystone Pipeline came before the board to discuss oil pipeline. Reports there is no significant news. At the federal level things are continuing very steadily. At the state level the Supreme Court is holding a hearing on September 5th to hear arguments. TransCanada continues to work with local landowners with easements and prepare for construction.

Tom Smith, Emergency Manager, came before the board for orientation of the Nance County Local Emergency Operations Plan (LEOP). The purpose of the LEOP is to describe the roles and responsibilities of the elected and appointed officials and state and federal agencies in support of the County's efforts to prevent, prepare for, respond to, recover from and mitigate against hazards and disasters. Board received a request for a letter of support for the THRIVES program through Central Nebraska Community Services (CNCS). Letters of support are requested annually. Moved by Voichoskie and seconded by Lani to sign a letter of support again this year. Roll Call: AYES–Voichoskie, Peterson, Lani, Jones, Horacek, Ditter, Jarecke; NAYS–None. Motion carried.

Dan Stankoski, Highway superintendent, provided a prepared Standardized System of Annual Reporting (SSAR) to the board. Approval of the SSAR will be placed on the agenda for the October 14, 2014 meeting. Road updates are given. South Branch Township is requesting to take back 2.5 miles of their township roads for grading purposes. The road is not a mail route. Discussion held. Wetovick suggested if they are allowed to take back the road, the county should write them a letter, acknowledging that they are taking back the maintenance of the road and set out in the letter the specific road that they will be maintaining. In addition the letter should set out the minimum standards for road maintenance that they will need to follow. One concern of the board is the safety of vehicles driving on these roads. They are driving along on a graveled county-maintained road and the road changes to a township road, sometimes with very little gravel, which could easily cause an accident, depending on weather conditions. There are already several roads in the county that switch from county roads to township roads. Jarecke questioned if the county should offer to take back a few more roads from the townships to keep them up properly, or change the road system to a county road system, whereby county would take over all roads. Board then discussed whether it would be wise to dissolve townships, or at least combine 2 or 3 townships into one. Townships seem to have a hard time getting people to serve on township boards. It was decided to send a letter to township boards and get their opinions. Road department continues to gravel county roads. Jarecke informs Stankoski of stop sign down by John Swertzic residence. Discussion held regarding a township that wants to gravel a minimum maintenance



road (MMR). Stankoski states that graveling a MMR is not legal and could put the county allocation money in jeopardy, unless the classification of the road was changed through the state. Voichoskie noted the problem with farmers planting too close to roads. It was decided to get a list of those farmers and send them a letter requesting them to refrain from planting too close to road next year and if they do not comply, the crop will be destroyed. Brett Houtby comes before the board to request gravel on a road to his dad's house. It is a mail route. He provided a video of the road as it appeared today after rainfall last night. Dan assured him the gravel truck will be on that road in the near future.

The board reviewed and approved the report from the Nance County Treasurer itemizing the amount of uncancelled personal property taxes as shown by distress warrants returned by the Nance County Sheriff. It is reported that warrant #2012-00005 was not collected and sent to the Merrick County Sheriff and Warrant #2012-00008 was not collected and sent to the Platte County Sheriff. Total collection from warrants is \$5,364.27

Ronda Malander, County Treasurer, was notified that the pledged collateral #36157FBP5 in the amount of \$249,000.00 issued to the Nance County Treasurer and reviewed and approved by the board on August 12, 2014 was incorrect. The amount of the pledged collateral should have been \$75,000.00. The board reviewed and approved other pledged collateral: #313382D75 in the amount of \$200,000.00 which is out and replaced with #254671R69 in the amount of \$245,000.00. Jennifer Wood, who has headed up the Fullerton Food Pantry for the last several years, is resigning the position at the end of the year. Discussion held on replacing Wood. It was suggested to run an ad in the paper for that position along with a food pantry board. It was reported that the Genoa Food Pantry is having a tough time keeping food on the shelves and the bank balance is low. If nothing is done, it could be closed in 6 months. The Fullerton Food pantry has a good supply of food and it was suggested that food from Fullerton be shared with Genoa. County Clerk brought to the board's attention a letter from the Property Tax Administrator regarding a recent decision in a case heard by the Tax Equalization and Review Commission which will result in a refund of a portion of Atlantic Southeast Airlines, Inc.'s taxes paid in 2006, 2007, 2008 and 2009. The amount Nance County will be required to refund is \$677.32.

Dan Stankoski, Highway Superintendent, previously submitted a prepared Standardized System of Annual Reporting to board for approval and signatures. Moved by Ditter and seconded by Lani to approve and sign the SSAR report. Roll Call: AYES–Ditter, Voichoskie, Peterson, Lani, Jones, Horacek, Jarecke; NAYS–None. Motion carried.

10:05 AM County Attorney present.

Stankoski gave road updates. Pictures of a collapsed bridge in the north end of the county were shown to the board. A tractor and grain cart were traveling over the bridge when the bridge collapsed. The bridge has a 9 ton limit and the weight of the tractor and grain cart well exceeded the weight limit of the bridge causing it to collapse. Stankoski contacted NIRMA and due to the fact that the equipment exceeded the weight limit of the bridge the owner of the equipment will be responsible for the damages. It was noted that there are many low tonnage bridges in the county. The board asked Stankoski and Wetovick to put together





an article/notice to run in the local papers reminding farmers to avoid bridges with low tonnage if their equipment exceeds the weight limit of the bridge.

Stankoski reports that project #63-200 on the one & six year plan is now complete. Next project is on N470th St. They are going to put in 2-48" arched culverts. Since it is getting late in the season, he asked the board if they would like him to go ahead and order the culverts? Board approved ordering the culverts and if they get the chance maybe get the culverts installed yet this fall and if not, they will be here in the spring to get started. Stankoski reports that they have only been doing spot graveling. Employee Josh Borgheiinck has given notice that he will be leaving employment with the county.

Darla Svoboda, Hamilton County Zoning Administrator came before the board. Also present are Bob McNeff and Jim Knopik. Svoboda was asked to share the research she's conducted over the years on Livestock Friendly County (LFC) legislation and the Nebraska Department of Agriculture's LFC Regulations. She finds the language in both to be vague and cautions against signing up for something that has the potential to put undue burden on county government. She went over requirements and guidelines on the application, some of which are not specific and when the Department of Agriculture was asked to define the requirements, they did not have answers. If a county does become designated through the State, they are able to drop out at any time, if they so choose. A county may also designate themselves as livestock friendly without going through the State as some counties have done. McNeff states he would like to see the county become livestock friendly. Knopik states that he does not understand why we would want to take something out of our hands and put it into the hands of the Department of Ag. He does not feel that the county needs to get the designation from the State. He would like to see the county self-designate themselves as livestock friendly. Jarecke states that our zoning regulations would trump the State's rules, if the county became designated through the Nebraska Department of Ag. Svoboda agrees with Jarecke. No decisions made at this time.

Megan Zoucha presents the board with an Interlocal Cooperation Agreement between Jefferson, Fillmore, Phelps, Franklin and Nance Counties with Jerry Knoche to perform property reviews. The cost to Nance County will be \$32,150.00. Discussion held. Moved by Horacek and seconded by Voichoskie to sign said Interlocal Agreement. Roll Call: AYES-Horacek, Ditter, Voichoskie, Peterson, Lani, Jones, Jarecke; NAYS-None. Motion carried.

Mary Baldridge, Zoning Administrator/Economic Dev. Director, came before the board on behalf of Eileen Stanczyk, who is in charge of the County Government Day. They are seeking funds from the county to pay for food/supplies/goodie bags for the day. She informed the board that the Boone/Nance Cattleman's Association is donating \$150.00 for beef for the sloppy joes. Candy's Kitchen will prepare and serve the food. Total amount needed is \$500.00. Moved by Horacek and seconded by Peterson to donate \$500.00 for the cost to host County Government Day. Roll Call: AYES-Horacek, Ditter, Voichoskie, Peterson, Lani, Jones, Jarecke; NAYS-None. Motion carried. Baldridge introduced Jennifer Smith. Who has volunteered to head up the Fullerton Food Pantry. Jennifer Wood will continue to help Smith throughout the 2014 year. A food pantry board has been established. Those members are: DeAnn Epley, Sandy VanDeWalle, Tom Smith, Ben Bakewell, Barbara Dubas and Mary Baldridge. They will meet one or two times a year. One thing they would like to improve is the voucher system to include fresh vegetables and meats.

Discussion held on preapproval of payroll. Present are Dave Moore, Ronda Malander, Megan Zoucha, and SuAnn Engel. Zarek explained, after the passage of LB560, the Nebraska Association of County Officials (NACO) encouraged that counties not approve claims for hours that have not yet been worked. Nance County does approve claims before hours are worked for several employees. Jarecke, Wetovick, Ronda Malander, Treasurer and Zarek had all sat in on a phone conference with Larry Dix, NACO Executive Director, and Beth Ferrell, NACO legal counsel. Many counties are making the switch from preapproving payroll to approval after the hours are worked. Several counties shared their conversion to the paying in arrears and using those, Zarek worked up a schedule to convert Nance County to switch the employees whose salaries are currently being preapproved to being approved after the hours are worked. In order to avoid missing a check, the employee could be given the option to turn over comp time, vacation or take a deduction in pay, which could be deducted from future paychecks, as the employee desires. Road updates. Present is Dan Stankoski, Road Superintendent. Stankoski presents a final settlement invoice on project 7063(6) in the amount of \$7,826.69. He asked the board what funds they would like to use to pay for the invoice. It was decided to use some of the bridge buyback program funds.

Contact was made with landowners on right-of-way purchase for project (63)114. Ron Stock inquired about moving the road North to make the road straight, but McDonald with JEO responded that wetlands are an issue in moving the road north. Anytime wetlands are impacted, a permit from the Corps of Engineers is required. The Corps requires that we select an alternative that is least environmentally damaging. In this situation there is a large quantity of wetlands on the section line and a curved alignment will minimize the impact to wetland and they will meet the safety standards required for this road.

Bridge (63)20820, which collapsed, will need a wetland delineation permit before construction can be started. McDonald was given the permission to move forward, so the project does not need to wait until spring. An estimate for the repairs will be submitted. The road may be eligible for a low water crossing. Stankoski has





inspected several wooden boxes for structure damage and has a few left to inspect. Department is rebuilding a stretch of road on N530th St. Also taking trees and brush out on N Nest Road; Projects completed: rebuilt hill on N350th St., N340th Ave & N480th Ave.; Built up road South of Belgrade next to the new asphalt; working on sign inventory; Bridge inspections are due; reports that Nance County has 66 bridges that are 20 feet or more in length. There have been breakdowns on the trucks, claims for those repairs ran through with today's claims.

Steve Martin with the Department of Agriculture is present to talk about livestock friendly counties. Also present are Mary Baldridge, Zoning Admin, and Bob McNeff. Martin explained that the program started in 2003 by the legislature as a way for counties to promote themselves and to grow the ag/livestock economy. It is another tool used by economic development. To become livestock friendly, the county only needs to hold a public hearing, pass a resolution requesting that its application be reviewed and approved, and submit the application. The application will be reviewed along with the county's zoning regulations, if such regulations exist. If the State finds that the county's zoning regulations do not fit the livestock friendly status, the county will be denied. Once approved, the County would only have to file an annual report, reporting any changes made to the county's zoning regulations, if any. Jarecke asked him if he would review Nance County's zoning regulations to see if they would pass the review. Baldridge had given him a copy of the regulations and he agreed to review them, but he cautioned them that it may be a while before he gets back to them as he is quite busy. He stated the county has nothing to lose in becoming livestock friendly. What you can gain depends on the county's goals. Several counties have gained new industries, such as ethanol plant, dairies etc.

Department has hauled clay off of black top south of Belgrade; built up corner on N 475th St.; and completed tube project (63)203 on N470th St. except for graveling. Bridge inspections are 90% complete. Sign inventory is next. Discussed responsibility of wooden box bridges that measure 20 or less, most on minimum maintenance roads. Stankoski reports on a mishap that occurred to overhead door at the West shop. One of the rails has been bent. He has called Duncan Door to get an estimate. Stankoski has completed 2 years on his Class B superintendent's license. He is sending in for his Class A. The allocation money that the county receives should double with the Class A designation, increasing the allocation from \$4,500 to \$9,000 per year. Darwin Homolka requested that the county remove trees/brush along the railroad near his place for better view of oncoming trains. Road department will look at and remove as needed.

Chad Svoboda and John Boeder with Strong Financial are present with new health insurance premiums for 2015. The insurance went up 15%. Figures were put together showing the savings for the past year after switching to CoOpportunity and even with the increase, the total cost of the increase is still lower than the cost of insurance when the county was on the NACO BC/BS insurance. Discussion held. It was noted that the recent change in moving the payroll to paying in arrears has already put a burden on some employees. Moved by Lani and seconded by Voichoskie to keep the insurance with CoOpportunity with the \$500.00 deductible and have the county absorb the increase of the insurance due to the payroll situation and

9:15 a.m. Chairman called the meeting to order.

It came to the Clerk's attention after the last meeting that the motion made by Lani regarding the health insurance premiums was misunderstood by several of the board members and it was decided the board would have to meet to further discuss. Since the health insurance is time sensitive, it was decided to meet by special meeting.

Discussion held. Lani explained that in his motion, he intended the county to pick up the increases for all levels of premiums: single coverage, 2-entity coverage & family coverage. He felt with the recent decision to change the payroll as paying in arrears, the employees should not have to also deal with the 15% increase of insurance rates. Voichoskie agreed. Jarecke objects to pay the increase on the 25% of the second entity and the family plan, which the county has no responsibility for in the first place. Ditter and Jones both agreed with Jarecke. Moved by Lani and seconded by Voichoskie to go with Co-opportunity, \$500.00 deductible and the county absorb the 15% increase for all levels of premiums including single coverage, 2 entity and family coverage. Difference between the two costs involved is \$407.00 per month. It affects 10 employees with 2 entity insurance and 5 employees with family plans. Jarecke stated that last year when the county went to Coopportunity the board wiped out the employee's share of their health insurance premium and took on 75% of the 2 entity cost. Now that the insurance has gone up the employees do not want to pay any of the increase. Pilakowski states that some employees are seeing a decrease in pay with the "pay in arrears". For example her pay will be decreased by \$33.00 per pay period. She realizes that they are not "losing" the money, but the employee will not see the money until they guit and receive their final check two weeks later. She feels the county could absorb the increase for this year alone. Next year when the "pay in arrears" has passed, she can't imagine that the employees will ask the county to absorb the increase. Ditter feels that employees could do a little better budgeting with their money, if they cannot absorb \$50.00 a month payment. Jones states that employees just received a 3% increase in wages. Wondered what that amounted to for each employee, but with different salary amounts, the increase is different for each employee. Malander states that the cost of insurance is a cost of doing business and the employees should not be expected to pay for the benefit every time there is an increase in insurance. Voichoskie feels that the county has good employees and all they receive is their 3% raise each year, no Christmas bonuses. Engel points out that the fact that the county has saved a lot of money since implementing the cash offered in lieu of employees taking the county insurance and changing from BC/BS to Co-opportunity.
