9:45 a.m. Rodney Wetovick, County Attorney present.

Board discussed contracting with an attorney to serve as a public defender for Nance County. The County spends a large amount of money annually for public defenders residing outside of Nance County and Wetovick thought it would be good to keep this money here in the county. He suggested that the board offer a contract to John Morgan. The board felt it would be a good idea, if Morgan is interested. Chairman asked Zarek to reach out to fellow clerks in like counties to see if they contract for a public defender and what amount they contract for. Horacek will work with Zarek on approaching Morgan and gathering information.

Ed Knott and Will Zoucha with Applied Connective came before the board to request the use of the county tower for placing three small boxes to allow them to serve the downtown businesses with wireless services. They are offering to pay the county the sum of \$600.00 annually to lease the tower space. They can submit a lease agreement for Wetovick to review before signing. Moved by Horacek and seconded by Voichoskie to allow Applied Connective to place the boxes on the county tower for wireless services, pending approval and signing of the lease agreement. General assistance application was reviewed by the board. Discussion held. Moved by Horacek and seconded by Voichoskie to pay the electric bill and the gas bill for the applicant for a total of \$353.60. Dan Stankoski, Highway Superintendent, gave road updates to the Board. He reminded them of the paving awards ceremony to be held on Tuesday, January 19th. Jarecke, Horacek and Stankoski plan on attending. Monte Keith is present to discuss the waste oil burner in the road building. The exhaust pipe for the burner comes out of the south wall of the road building just in front of Keith's garage. As far as he can tell, the south wall of the road building is right on the lot line. Stankoski admits Keith has a legitimate complaint. Discussion held. Stankoski will get the burner looked at as it apparently is not working correctly and he will get the burner moved to a different location so Keith does not have to put up with this in the future. Stankoski reported on the fuel consumption for the motor graders, track loader and excavator. Discussed whether or not to contract fuel. Moved by Horacek and seconded by Cornwell to contract 15,000 gallons of fuel at \$1.70/gal. Roll Call: AYES-Horacek, Cornwell, Carlson, Small, Jarecke; NAYS-Ditter Voichsokie. Motion carried. Stankoski inquired if he should go ahead and advertise the 613 dirt scraper. Eddie Bomar with CAT feels the scraper is worth around \$12,000.00. Another option would be to advertise with Big Iron. Moved by Horacek and seconded by Cornwell to advertise the 613 dirt scraper for sale with Big Iron. Roll Call: AYES-Horacek. Cornwell, Carlson, Small, Ditter, Voichoskie, Jarecke; NAYS-None. Motion carried. Stankoski reports that Project 63(190) is complete until April 1, 2016, when the dirt work will begin. It was suggested to keep the alternate routes well graveled during the project with the county paying for the gravel. Stankoski is now working on the 1 & 6 year plan and asked the board to let him know if they have anything they felt needed to be added to the 1 & 6 year plan. Stankoski will need to attend a training Thursday on new minimum road standards. It will also cover the updated NBCS Form 7 that he is required to submit annually. Grant Miller came before the board to make them aware that he will be locating and tying out section corners for the Hwy 22 State paving project. Although the State will reimburse the county for the costs associated with the project, it will affect the county surveyor's budget.

Horacek has been in contact with Jane Swartz, negotiating a price regarding the sale of 2 lots in the SE corner of the block that the road building is situated. She has agreed that she would sell the lots for \$3,000.00 each (\$6,000.00 total). She would like to retain the garage and move it off the property and she would like the county to deliver the cut walnut trees out to her farm. Discussion held. Moved by Horacek and seconded by Cornwell to purchase Lots 4 & 5, Block 11, County Addition, Fullerton, Nance County, Nebraska for the sum of \$6,000.00 from Jane Swartz. County agrees to cut the walnut trees and deliver out to Swartz farm, and the seller retains the garage, giving the seller 6 months to remove. Wetovick will prepare a purchase agreement for

Mary Baldridge, Zoning Administrator, is present for appointment of new board of representative to the Nance County Development Agency to replace Andrew Ditter, who is stepping down. Moved by Voichoskie and seconded by Cornwell to reappoint Bob Knowinski, Dale Lassek, Tim Morthole, Chuck Delancey, Dan Wetovick and alternate, Natalie Sharman for a 3year term to the Nance County Board of Adjustment. Baldridge provided some information on the Northeast Nebraska Economic Development District (NENEDD) membership. Discussion held. Roll Call: AYES-Horacek, Small, Ditter, Voichoskie, Jarecke; NAYS-None; ABSENT-Carlson, Cornwell. Motion carried.—Stankoski reports that the 612 dirt scraper has been advertised with Big Iron and will be on-line until Feb. 24, 2016. Big Iron receives 12% commission on sales of \$1,000-\$5000, and





10% commission on sales of \$5,000-\$50,000.—Projects: continue on snow removal--going to put tree shredder back on the excavator.—One & Six year road plan public hearing is set for Feb. 9, 2016 from 10:00 a.m. to 11:00 a.m.—Stankoski reports that there is a balance of \$115,699.62 on the 2014 CAT 12M2 grader—discussed the need for a new/used dump truck to haul dirt and gravel.

10:25 a.m. Moved by Horacek and seconded by Voichoskie to go into executive session to discuss personnel. Roll Call: AYES-Horacek, Small, Ditter, Voichoskie, Jarecke; NAYS-None; ABSENT-Carlson, Cornwell. Motion carried.

10:40 a.m. Moved by Horacek and seconded by Small to go out of executive session. Roll Call: AYES-Horacek, Small, Ditter, Voichoskie, Jarecke; NAYS-None; ABSENT-Carlson, Cornwell. Motion carried.

Chairman states that no action was taken during closed session.

Lease Agreement between Nance County, City of Genoa, and Twin River Public Schools on the ownership of the Road building in Genoa was presented to the board, signed by the City of Genoa and the Twin River Public Schools. Each entity was paying for insurance on the portion of the building in which they occupy. The insurance companies have discouraged this. The County, City of Genoa and School have agreed upon a lease agreement. The County will insure the whole building and the City of Genoa and Twin River Schools will each reimburse the County for their share. Moved by Horacek and seconded by Voichoskie to sign said lease agreement. Roll Call: AYES-Horacek, Small, Ditter, Voichoskie, Jarecke; NAYS-None; ABSENT-Carlson, Cornwell, Motion carried.

Discussion held on whether or not to contract for a public defender. John Morgan is present. Morgan states that he would be interested in working out a contract with the County for the position. State Law requires that employees receive at least one-half hour lunch





break during an 8 hour shift. He has made them aware of the law and expects them to take lunch breaks in the future; He will be advertising for another road employee.

Brett Houtby is present to discuss reimbursement for opening roads after the snow storm. The County was unable to get his roads opened in a timely manner, due to the amount of snow received in the last storm and Mr. Houtby spent 10 hours opening county roads for himself and a neighbor. It was also noted that the trucks traveled on a county road that was, at the time, under construction. It was also observed that the trucks did not obey traffic signs as they made their deliveries—Spoke with Jerry Westring about the box culvert project on N 140th Ave. Westring may have to subcontract the project as he has lost a lot of his crew after suffering a heart attack—Stankoski hopes to start on project (216) on N 200th Ave, on the 1 & 6 year map soon; waiting on culverts—continue to haul clay on S 550th St.—will do tube extensions on S 580th St.—Jarecke would like the maintainer operators to keep moving the windrows on the county roads—there has been a request to place a stop sign stopping North bound traffic at the intersection of N 200th Ave. and Valley Road. Stankoski will have Brian MacDonald do a road study of the intersection—Road Department still has tree stumps and trees to remove from Swartz lot—Stankoski reports that he had talked to Rick Collins regarding cleaning the lot off that he traded with the County and Collins stated he had 2-3 days of hauling concrete and then he would move over to the lot.
