The Board reviewed and approved the Monthly Fee reports of the County Clerk in the amount of \$3,533.56; Clerk of the District Court in the amount of \$261.59; and County Sheriff in the amount of \$4,013.52.

There being no further business, old or new, to come before the Board of Supervisors, it was moved by Small and seconded by Cornwell to adjourn Sine Die at 9:30 a.m. Roll Call: AYES-Small, Nelson, Ditter, Voichoskie, Horacek, Cornwell, Jarecke; NAYS-None. Motion carried.

The County Clerk acting as chairperson called the meeting to order with the first order of business being the selection of the Chairman and Vice-Chairman of the Board for 2017. Prior to the selection of chairman, Dennis Jarecke, addressed the board, stating that he has served as chairman for many years and feels it is time for a change. He has enjoyed doing this, but feels any board member elected can do just as good a job, or even better, than he has done, adding that the County Clerk makes the job easy to do. He quoted Winston Churchill "I benefited greatly from your criticism and at no time have I suffered from a lack thereof" (not meaning the supervisors, but the county in whole). He also quoted William Tecumseh Sherman "If I am nominated I will not run; if elected I will not serve". Selection process used was secret ballot. Chairman vote was as follows: Cornwell-4, Ditter-3. Cornwell was declared Chairman. Vice-Chairman vote was as follows: Ditter-3, Jarecke-2, Horacek-1, Voichoskie-1. Ditter was declared Vice-Chairman.

The meeting was turned over to Chairman Cornwell.

Tom Smith, Emergency Manager, came before the board to inform them of an upcoming training, called EM101. The training is for elected officials. (Mainly Supervisors, but other officials are welcome to attend) The Assistant Director of the Nebraska Emergency Management Agency and other top officials will give an overview of Emergency Management. It is scheduled for January 24th at 1:30 p.m. in the Fullerton Fire Hall. Other upcoming meetings/workshops include—a Community Organizations Active in Disaster (COAD) meeting this Thursday, January 12th at 2:00 p.m. at the Presbyterian Church—Friday, January 13th at 10:00 a.m. at the Fullerton Fire Hall is a meeting with the Chief Information Officer to discuss a state radio system—Thursday, January 19th from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. at the Lancaster County Health Department in Lincoln is an Incident Command System/Emergency Operations Center Interface Workshop—at 7:00 p.m. on Tuesday, January 24th there is scheduled a Local Emergency Planning Committee (LEPC) meeting in Genoa to discuss hazardous materials.

Dan Stankoski, Highway Superintendent, is present for road updates. The tractor lease with Dinkel's will be up on April 1st. There are two options for the upcoming lease: \$24.00/hr. (minimum of 200 hours) to continue the current lease or if the board would like to increase the rate to \$26.00/hr. (200 hour minimum) Dinkel's could build a tractor with a front 3 point PTO for use with the snow blower. The front PTO would make it much easier for someone to operate the snow blower, especially if it was necessary to operate the blower for a number of hours. Discussion held. Moved by Nelson and seconded by Jarecke to lease a tractor with the front 3 point PTO at \$26/hr. Roll Call: AYES-Nelson, Ditter, Voichoskie, Horacek, Jarecke, Small, Cornwell; NAYS-None. Motion carried. Discussion held on the applications received for the road/weed superintendent position. The interviewing committee recommends that Chad Borowiak be hired. Moved by Ditter and seconded by Horacek to hire Chad Borowiak as road employee/weed superintendent. Roll Call: AYES-Ditter, Voichoskie, Horacek, Jarecke, Small, Nelson, Cornwell; NAYS-None. Motion carried. Borowiak will start at \$14.00/hour.—The NDOR has announced their selection of the County Bridge Match Program and Nance County did not make the 1st go around, but there will be another round we could qualify for—Stankoski would like to start looking for a good used trac loader. The one the county has is a 1988 model with 7,000 hours on it. Maybe consider it for the next budget year; he will have Eddie Bomar keep an eye out for one—If weather permits, dept. plans on working on filling a large washout along N480th St.—giving the two last hires an increase in wages; they are very good employees—continue to cut trees—took excavator in to get serviced.

Megan Zoucha came before the board to inform them of a new appraisal package through Vanguard. Currently she uses MIPS, who contracts with Marshall & Swift Appraisal. She has attended a presentation and workshop with Vanguard and there is no comparison to the current program. She would like to invite representatives from Vanguard to make a presentation to the board.

Mary Baldridge, Zoning Administrator, is present for appointment of three board of representatives to the Nance County Planning and Zoning Commission. Three members' terms are up: Lynn Belitz, Brett Houtby and Dennis McCoig. Shane Czarnick is also interested in serving. McCoig offered to step down since he now lives in Fullerton. Discussion held. Moved by Ditter and seconded by Small to reappoint Belitz and Houtby and to appoint Shane Czarnick, each for a 3-year term, to the Nance County Planning and Zoning Commission. The appointment of a new board of representative to the Nance County Development Agency to fill the vacancy of James Carlson is necessary. Discussion held. Mary Baldridge presented updates to the General Assistance manual for discussion. The manual must be updated every 2 years. The update includes a new figure for income resource guidelines, based on 75% of the Poverty Guidelines updated in the Federal Register by DHHS. This raised the figure from \$729.00 to \$742.50 for a one person household; from \$983.00 to \$1,001.25 for a two person related household; and an additional \$258.75 for each additional related household member. Figures for maximum payments per month allowed for shelter and non-food necessities were figured two ways: a 1.3% average inflation increase and a





25% increase. The board requested that she use the 1.3% increase for the shelter and a 25% increase for the non-food necessities. Baldridge will make the requested changes and the board will approve the updated manual at the January 24th meeting.

The Board reviewed and approved the Monthly Fee reports of the County Clerk in the amount of \$4,201.12; Clerk of the District Court in the amount of \$207.24; and County Sheriff in the amount of \$927.98.

The Region 44 Emergency Management of Boone, Merrick and Nance Counties is looking into a study of the infrastructure within each county and the possibility for dispatch consolidation. The cost of the study is \$9,500.00. It is suggested that each county pay a one-third portion of the cost of the study. (\$3,166.67) Jarecke provided the board with information and a discussion was held. Dan Stankoski had previously received a quote from NMC for a new ditch bucket for the excavator in the amount of \$8,410.38. The old bucket is cracked and has been welded time and time again. Board approves purchase of a new bucket, if it is in the budget. The lot in Belgrade with the road building and also the Fullerton lots, recently acquired east of the current road building have now been surveyed. Choyeski will be able to start on the new building in Belgrade in a couple of weeks. Fullerton property ready for fence to be installed.—1976 bridge truck is on its last leg. It is used mainly to haul culverts. Instead of purchasing a new truck, Bernt suggests looking into purchasing a flatbed trailer to haul the culverts. Could also be used to haul skidsteer to projects. Board approves—Sapp Brothers is setting Fullerton shop up with bulk oil and DEF. There will be a cost savings of 50 cents per gallon on DEF & approx.. \$1.00/gallon on oil—A county resident questioned whether a landowner was using county right of way. An aerial photograph of the land in question along with survey boundaries was reviewed and it is found that the landowner is not using the county ROW.—Discussion held on the need for 8 gauge culverts for Project C63-218. Some board members feel the project could be completed with 10 gauge culverts. Bids were opened. Ace/Eaton Metals bid: \$38,407.12; Midwest Service and Sales Co. bid: \$39,498.96; Midwest submitted an alternate quote for 10 gauge culverts. Further discussion held. Moved by Jarecke and seconded by Nelson to reject bids received and accept the alternate quote for 10 gauge culverts received from Midwest Service and Sales, pending discussion between Gerrard, highway superintendent, and Brian McDonald, engineer, to see if the 10 gauge culverts will meet our needs. John Boeder with Strong Financial came before the board to discuss the Cash in Lieu option on the health insurance plan through the First Concord, cafeteria plan. An amended official document was never signed when the county added the cash in lieu option, even though First Concord was made aware of the addition. Also the laws on the cash in lieu have changed and may now be offered to Medicare eligible employees. The Cash Out Option form for employees has been updated to allow Medicare eligible employees to take the Cash in Lieu. The amended official document for First Concord is signed by the Chairman.

Will Zoucha with Applied Connective came before the board to discuss WiFi for the courthouse & Antivirus computer protection. The quote for them to provide anti-virus to the 26 computers owned by the County would run \$676.00 per year. After checking on Amazon it was found that the county could order enough Norton anti-virus protection for 30 computers at a cost of \$150.00 per year. After discussion, it was decided to stay with the Norton Anti-Virus protection. A quote for WiFi in the courthouse was received. The cost for the county would be a one-time \$1,710.00 fee. Discussion held and the board decided to install the WiFi. The board had switched the phone system to Applied Connective a few years back. At that time the Hamilton & CenturyLink networks could've been consolidated, then if one network went out it would roll over to the other network. Don Shuda, Nance County Veteran's Officer, came before the board to discuss the Veteran's Service Office 2017-2018 budget. Expected delivery in 6–8 weeks – weed sprayer is up and running – dates for trainings on the highway superintendent test were discussed. Bernt will attend the trainings in preparation for the test.

Carrie Rodriguez, district 5 chief probation officer, came before the board to introduce herself. She has served as chief deputy for the past 7 years and is now serving as chief probation officer. She reports that the



probation office has helped 77 Nance County clients in the past year. She also reported that the budget request from Nance County will go up an additional \$144.00 (from \$7,368.00 to \$7,512.00). She answered questions of the board.

Board reviewed proposed budgets for Weed Superintendent with Chad Borowiak and the Road Department with Tony Bernt

Tony Bernt, road foreman, gave updates in the road department. Also present is LeRoy Gerrard, interim Highway Superintendent. Bernt reports tubes for project C63-218 are in, work to begin on July 10th—Continue to replace and repair culverts throughout the county—New track loader is expected to be delivered this week—New Titan trailer is expected in 4 weeks—Digging ditches on Valley Rd. & starting to rebuild shoulders on S560th St.—Will be replacing tubes for N480th St. soon. Road will be closed approximately 3 days—1995 Ford dump truck is at Midwest Hydraulics in G.I. to replace cylinder seals—sent pipe list to Midwest Service and Ace Eaton for quotes—Have some concerns on roads in Loup Ferry township. Roads are closed, but records in courthouse show they are still open. Gerrard will go out and look at them to determine what needs to be done--Discussion held on allowing Simon Contracting to begin dirt work on project C63-198 earlier than the projected start date of the bridge. Board agrees that Simon Contracting may begin the dirt work as early as August 1, 2017—Discussion held on what the board would like to do with the old road building in Belgrade. It was decided that the building will be sold. Clerk will advertise for bids. Winning bidder will be required to remove the building from the site and a certain length of time will be allowed for the removal. The approach to the new building is ready to be poured along with a 10'x20' pad for a heated room to store the DEF for the maintainer & possible restroom in the future. compensate the employee with compensatory (comp) time off for the hours between 37.5 hours and 40 hours. Those hours must be paid in cash with their payroll check. Any hours over 40 hours may then be paid either in cash or comp time at the rate of time and one-half. Although, an employer <u>may</u> pay an employee straight comp time for hours over the 37.5 hours as long as the employee does not work more than 40 hours in that week. The county had been paying both hours between 37.5 hours and 40 hours with straight comp time and hours over 40 with comp time at time and one-half whether the employee worked less than 40 hours or more than 40 hours. Moved by Jarecke and seconded by Nelson to begin following the Department of Labor Compensatory Time-Off as stated in their Opinion Letter as of August 1, 2017. John Boeder with Gallagher, formerly Strong Financial, came before the board to present a life insurance benefit to offer to county employees. Before the discussion on the life insurance, Boeder informed the board that the United Health Care health insurance option that the board went with last month was a good choice, as the premiums for BC/BS and Aetna came in well above the rates offered by UHC. He also informs the board that the dental insurance offered through the county has had a small increase. The premiums are increasing \$.82/mo. The premiums are still a good rate at \$28.12/mo. for a single premium. Boeder then went on to explain the term life insurance benefit. Employees can get a \$10,000-\$100,000 policy of term life insurance. The premiums are age rated, with the premium increasing as the employee ages. A policy for a spouse can be added at 50% of the value of the employee's coverage at the employee's premium rate and an employee's children, through the age of 26, can be added for a premium of \$.29-\$2.91/mo. depending on the amount of insurance requested. The rate for children is the same no matter how many children the employee has on the insurance. The employee would be responsible for the full premium rate. Discussion held. Moved by Horacek and seconded by Jarecke to offer this benefit to the employees, with the employee being responsible for the premiums. Tony Bernt was going to get her some figures on the cost, as they had switched out lights in the road building, but she has not heard back yet. Board asked Engel to check into what it would cost to switch the lights.

repairing & replacing signs—working with Tom Smith, emergency manager, on the new sign tracking process (helps on inventory & in case damage disaster happens)—building across the street from the courthouse has been gutted, cleaned out and ready for inspection—getting ready to start shredding trees in Right-of-Ways—1995 Ford dump truck had the clutch go out-also needs a new cylinder. Cylinder is still under warranty—continue to prepare machines for winter—Discussion held on electric fences in ROW. They will run a notice in the newspapers. Letters will be sent to violators.

Gerrard discussed the Nebraska Dept. of Transportation (NDOT) Round 2 of the County Bridge Match Program. It is a 50% match. Julie Beyer, with the Central Nebraska Youth Services program, came before the board to provide information regarding the Interlocal Cooperation Agreement for Juvenile Service between Merrick, Nance, Polk and Hamilton Counties. Nance County falls into a category 2 of the study and the minimum recommended base salary is \$48,600.00 and the recommended high salary is \$67,700.00. The study recommends that sheriffs, who do not operate a jail, receive 115% of the base salary set. The study suggests that compensation for part-time county attorneys be made on a county-by-county basis, with consideration given to the fact that attorneys require specialized training and continuing legal education. The board will further review the salary recommendations and clerk will put the discussion on the agenda for the next meeting.

RESOLUTION #17-31

WHEREAS, Pursuant to Section 23-1114 of the Revised Statutes of the State of Nebraska, the Board of Supervisors are required to determine and set the salaries of the various elected officials of the County prior to January 15th of the year in which a General Election will be held for the respective offices;

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors of Nance County, Nebraska met in order to establish the salaries for the Elected Officials of Nance County, Nebraska, for the term commencing January 2019, pursuant to Nebraska Law. After conferring with County Officials and citizens, and after reviewing the financial situation of County Government, the Board finds that it is necessary and reasonable to establish new salaries for the Elected Officials of Nance County, Nebraska;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Board of Supervisors of Nance County, Nebraska, that the annual salary for the following elected offices commencing January 2019:

County Assessor, County Clerk and County Treasurer \$50,000.00 County Attorney (part-time), County Sheriff \$57,500.00 County Supervisors (part-time) \$12,500.00

with the Chairman receiving an additional \$200.00/month.

Further, each official shall receive a 3% increase on the first day of January in the years 2020, 2021 and 2022.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that in addition to the above salary each Elected Official shall receive during his or her term of office, health insurance as set annually by the Board of Supervisors of Nance County; or an opt-out (aka "cash in lieu of") provision, if an Elected Official opts out of the county health insurance plan; and a \$15,000.00 life insurance policy. Elected officials shall be enrolled in and shall receive the benefits of the



County Employee's Retirement System, to participate in such programs on the effective date of such programs as approved by the County Board.
