A meeting of the County Board of Supervisors of Nance County, Nebraska was convened in open and public session on January 9, 2018 in the Supervisor's Room, Nance County Courthouse, Fullerton, Nebraska.

Chairman, Timothy Cornwell, called the meeting to order at 9:15 a.m. with the following members present-Timothy Cornwell, Andrew Ditter, Robert Voichoskie, Ralph Horacek, Dennis Jarecke, Robert Small and Darren Nelson. Also present is County Clerk, Danette Zarek and County Sheriff, Ben Bakewell. Chairman advised those present of the open meetings act and its posting in the Supervisor's Room.

Notice of the meeting was given thereof by publication in the Nance County Journal on January 4, 2018.

Notice of the meeting was given to the Board and a receipt of their acknowledgment is on file in the Clerk's office.

Bakewell informed the board that he is meeting with Platte Valley Communications today to look at the communications equipment and give him prices and options to replace the equipment. Bakewell should have some numbers for the board at the next meeting. Nelson stated that Boone County may now be interested in the communications consolidation. Bakewell will contact them. Bakewell also informed the board that Steve Foster will be on the February 13, 2018 agenda to discuss a memorial plaque for Sheriff, Dave Johnson, who was shot and killed in the line of duty.

Tony Bernt, road foreman, gave updates in the road department. Shredding trees in West Newman, East Newman & Prairie Creek townships—have had a few breakdowns with the excavator—roof of Fullerton shop had a leak. It has been repaired and now they are replacing drywall in parts room—creating a map to show where all road tubes are located—Project 198 is complete. Roadway is being graveled today. Can be opened now or wait until final inspection on Jan. 18th. Board suggested waiting until the final inspection is complete. Bernt is going to discuss the guard rail on the bridge; as it only goes to the end of the bridge—Bernt suggested putting heat in the Genoa shop. He can purchase a new oil burner unit for \$6,500.00. Department has plenty of oil to burn. Oil burner in the Fullerton shop has saved a lot of money. The shop would also need to be insulated—Board asked him to get bids on spray-on insulation.

LED lights have replaced the florescent bulbs in the courthouse hallways. At the present time there are 96 lightbulbs that need replacing in the courthouse offices. Question as to whether the board would like to go with LED bulbs in the offices, replacing one office at a time and using florescent bulbs in remaining offices until all florescent bulbs have been depleted. The LED bulbs are much brighter and last a lot longer. Board agreed.

Build-design proposals were opened. Present are Tom Sonderup and Ryan Sonderup with the Ag. Society, Steve Pritchard, Extension Educator, Jeff Horn with the 4-H Council, and Gary Peters with Chief Construction. First proposal is from Fowler Construction, Genoa, Nebraska for a 60' x 80' building for a total cost of \$480,000.00; Second proposal is from B-D Construction for a 60' x 80 building for a total cost of \$574,000.00; Third proposal is from Chief Construction for a 48' x 100' building for a total cost of \$429,630.00. Moved by Nelson and seconded by Ditter to send the proposals to the Committee for evaluation and recommendation. Roll Call: AYES-Nelson, Ditter, Voichoskie, Horacek, Jarecke, Small, Cornwell; NAYS-None. Motion carried. Nelson informed the board that a contractor had looked over the 4-H building and made a suggestion to restore/remodel the 4-H building and thought it should be looked into. The board would need to see the costs associated with this option, before considering it. Cornwell gave an update on the ownership transfer of the fairgrounds. He states that the Fullerton City Council has made a verbal commitment to deed a portion of the real estate to Nance County. The ground is now being surveyed. The lease on the remainder of the real estate will be renewed.

Tom Smith, Emergency Manager, informs the board that Belgrade has been approved for a new siren. The Belgrade fire district owns and maintains the siren, but they are not a sub-applicant within the Mass Litigation Plan so the county will need to be the co-applicant for the application and Belgrade fire district will then pay the county for their portion. Homeland Security will pay for 75% of the cost and the county will pay 25%. Moved by Ditter and seconded by Jarecke to authorize Cornwell to sign the siren grant application and financial commitment letter. Smith also gave the board information on a Senior Official Training and Table Top Exercise that has been set for January 24, 2018. All board members are invited to attend.

Smith would like to set up a meeting with the LEPC committee, so the committee members can get to know each other.

Robert Prokop came before the board questioning a bill he received from the County for mowing ditches. He presented the board with an affidavit from the person who does his agricultural work, stating that he had mowed the ditches this summer. The board informed Mr. Prokop that he will not need to pay the mowing bill. Prokop also explained to the board several places in the county where he states the ditch drainage is poor. One area is near his land on the Nance/Merrick county line. When there is a heavy rain, the water runs through the culvert and across his and other owner's land. He asked the board to take a look at these areas. He would also like to see the trees cleared out of other ditches. Board informs him that the road department is headed that way with the shredder. Another concern is farming in the ditches. Chairman states that the board has been working on this problem. Prokop thanked the board for their time.

Tony Bernt, Road foreman, gave updates in the road department. Department is continuing to work on snow removal from roadways—The oil heater has been installed in the Genoa shop and is up and running. He will be getting bids on insulating—He is looking into Network Fleet Pricing for all county roads equipment and vehicles. It is a diagnostic and maintenance program, much like the Caterpillar program on the motor graders. Verizon has a similar set up that can review location and status of each unit as far back as the day the plan is started. For 9 units, other than motor graders, there is a one-time set up fee of \$971.41. Thereafter there would be a monthly fee of \$170.55 for the 9 units. This program would give the road department great service records and records of when and where roads have been graveled. Board approved the set-up of the program—A certificate of substantial completion on project C63(198) is received and reviewed. Moved by Horacek and seconded by Nelson to sign the Certificate of Substantial Completion. Roll Call: AYES-Horacek, Jarecke, Small, Nelson, Ditter, Voichoskie, Cornwell; NAYS-None. Motion carried.

Dana Peterson with Design Build Procure is present to discuss the 4-H design build project. He went over the design build process and explained the duties of a Performance Criteria Developer (PCD). The board asked Mr. Peterson to come back to the next meeting with the amount of what his fee would be if the board appointed him as the PCD on this project.

Ben Bakewell, County Sheriff, submitted prices/options on communications equipment. The cost for a 2-seat dispatch console is \$235,000.00; cost for a 1-seat console is \$186,000.00. Jarecke asked Bakewell to continue checking on communications consolidation—Bakewell also explained the trunk system for communications which, when installed in a cruiser, would act as a tower for the deputy. To install 4 trunk systems, it would cost \$8,825.00. Bakewell would like to see the trunk system installed in 4 of the deputy units, but he just ordered new radios for the deputies and the funds are not in his budget. It was suggested that he wait and see how well the new radios work. The purchase could be looked at in the next budget year. Another



suggestion was to check into the 9-1-1 fund to see if the system would qualify for a 2913 fund purchase—Bakewell also informed the board that deputy Kyle Hansen is leaving the department and taking a job closer to family—The sheriff's department will be hosting a training on February 6th and 7th here in the courtroom.

Beth Sonderup, extension office manager, introduced Mariah Woolsoncroft, the State of Nebraska beef educator. Mariah represents 7 counties and has her office here in Nance County. Sonderup then submitted the Nebraska State Fire Marshal Code Review for the extension renovation project. The code review listed 12 items that the building will need to conform with before approval. Thomas Construction reviewed the code review and computed additional costs to conform with the Fire Marshal's Code Review. The Board approved the additional costs.

Allen Chlopek, Zoning Administrator, presented information on a lot split request by Kenneth King, splitting 15.61 acres off of a tract of land in the W½ NW¼ of Section 1, Township 16 North, Range 6 in Nance County. Discussion held. Moved by Ditter and seconded by Small to approve said lot split. Roll Call: AYES-Ditter, Voichoskie, Horacek, Jarecke, Small, Nelson, Cornwell; NAYS-None. Motion carried.

Chlopek presented information on a lot split request by John Jacobi, splitting 4.5 acres off of a tract of land in the SE¼ of Section 1, Township 17 North, Range 4 in Nance County. Discussion held. Moved by Jarecke and seconded by Small to approve said lot split. Roll Call: AYES-Jarecke, Small, Nelson, Ditter, Voichoskie, Horacek, Cornwell; NAYS-None. Motion carried.

Chlopek informs the board that Galen Frenzen has resigned from the Planning and Zoning Committee and Jon Epley is willing to serve in his place. Discussion held. Moved by Jarecke and seconded by Horacek to appoint Jon Epley to replace Galen Frenzen as member of the Nance County Planning and Zoning Committee. Roll Call: AYES-Jarecke, Small, Nelson, Ditter, Voichoskie, Horacek, Cornwell; NAYS-None. Motion carried.

Nance County Treasurer's Semi-Annual Statement July 1, 2017 through December 31, 2017 is reviewed and approved by the board. Ronda Malander, County Treasurer, is present to update the board on the County AS400 equipment. The AS400 is older and the tapes needed for backup are obsolete. MIPS, the software provider for the Treasurer's office, is migrating to a PC based operation, and the treasurer's current equipment will no longer be compatible. Malander will need to upgrade the equipment in her office. The clerk's office will continue to use the county AS400. If it fails to work, the clerk's office will be able to use the State AS400, therefore eliminating the need for the county to replace the County AS400.

The board received a second amendment to the agreement between the Department of Health & Human Services and Nance County. Wetovick explained the amendment to the board. They are willing to provide the internet service for free to the county in exchange for the county providing the tower space for free. Applied Connective could also provide e-mail service. For that service there would be a fee. Discussion held. Moved by Horacek and seconded by Ditter to switch internet from Hamilton services to Applied Connective. The dept. has put up barricades and will fix & reattach the guardrail. No reports of who damaged the guardrail. He will have Dan Theis come and inspect the bridge to be sure there was no structural damage done to the bridge. Clerk will check with NIRMA to see if there is coverage for bridge damage—Gerrard reports that Project C63(132) Bridge #C006320810 was accepted for the 2017 County Bridge Match Program. Said bridge is 1.5 miles East of Belgrade. The program will pay for 55% of the replacement costs. The bridge structure will be replaced with culvert pipes—Working on 1 & 6 year plan for 2018-2019. No new projects added to the plan. 1 & 6 year public hearing is scheduled for February 27th at 10:00 a.m.

Steve Foster does not appear. Bakewell had talked to Foster and his request is for wall space to display a memorial plaque on the wall of the courthouse to honor Dave Johnson, who was shot and killed





during his term as the Nance County Sheriff. Bakewell stated that there will not be a cost to the county for the plaque. Donations will be used to purchase the plaque. Jarecke suggested that a plaque also be displayed for M.J. Schumacher who also was shot and killed during his term as a Nance County Supervisor. All board members agree to the displays.

Ben Bakewell presented information on the communications equipment costs and consolidation costs. Also present are representatives with Platte Valley Communications, Boone County Sheriff, Denny Johnson, and Boone County Commissioner, Ken Luettel, Region 44 Emergency Manager, Tom Smith, Nance County Deputies, Steven Schwarz, Lathan Woollen, Eric Griffin, Dispatchers, Candi Beed, Kayla Cernik, Beverly Plumbtree, Vonda Plumbtree, Wendy Lemming, with Justice Data Solutions, and Mike McCray. The board had asked Bakewell to check into the county consolidating their communications with a neighboring county. Bakewell explained that whether or not the county would consolidate with another county, some equipment would need updated or replaced. He received costs to consolidate with Region 26, which is located a distance from Nance County. Boone County, Platte County and Hamilton County are currently upgrading their systems, but their upgrades are not complete and his suggestion is to wait until these counties have their systems up and running before making a decision as to which county would be the best fit for Nance County to consolidate with. As to the current problems, he suggested updating the GEO Comm system, (current mapping system we are two upgrades behind on this system) which it is estimated to cost between \$40,000-50,000. He also suggested implementing a Computer Aided Dispatching (CAD) system, through Justice Data Systems, which is estimated to cost \$25,000. He anticipates that \$20,000 would be paid with a grant, leaving the county to pay \$5,000-6,000. There is currently \$92,000.00 in Fund 2914 - 9-1-1 Wireless Holding Fund, which would cover those costs. He would also suggest replacing the deputies' handheld radios with new handheld portable radios with repeaters in the law enforcement vehicles. The new radios would work anywhere in the county. The cost for that is \$100,000. He has \$31,000 in his budget and he feels at the end of the budget year he would have a good amount of money left in the Jail fund to go towards the additional \$70,000. He asked that the board allow him to use inheritance tax money to cover the \$70,000 and pay it back. All of these updates are necessary whether or not the county would consolidate and would make the consolidation process seamless, if the county decides to consolidate in a couple of years. Discussion held. Moved by Jarecke and seconded by Horacek to go ahead with the update the GEO Comm system and implement the CAD system, using the 9-1-1 Wireless Holding Fund, and purchase the portable handheld radios using the Inheritance Tax money to pay for the shortfall in funds, to be reimbursed. Also received bids on a snow plow for the motor grader for \$11,700.00 and a bid for a snow plow for the 950 pay loader for \$10,500.00. The new motor grader could be here in August. Discussion held. Discussion held. Moved by Nelson and seconded by Horacek to table the discussion to the next meeting to allow them to consult with County Attorney. Roll Call: AYES—Nelson, Ditter, Voichoskie, Horacek, Jarecke, Small, Cornwell; NAYS—None. Motion carried.

Paul Moyer, State weed inspector with the Nebraska Department of Agriculture, is present with Chad Borowiak, Nance County Weed Superintendent, to review weed scores. Moyer is pleased with the weed control that Borowiak has been doing since taking the position. There are still a few areas that need improvement, but Moyer is certain that the county scores will increase again next year.

Jerad Reimers, Community Liaison with Adrian Smith's office, came before the board to update them on what the Congressman has been working on. He then answered questions of the board.

11:30 a.m. Voichoskie excused.

Board reviewed the Treasurer's Semi-Annual Statement for January 1, 2018 through June 30, 2018. Moved by Nelson and seconded by Horacek to approve the Nance County Treasurer's Semi-Annual



Statement. Roll Call: Nelson, Ditter, Horacek, Jarecke, Small, Cornwell; NAYS-None, ABSENT-Voichoskie. Motion carried

SuAnn Engel, budget preparer, presented the board with preliminary budget figures, per previous discussions. The tax rate as proposed is .257 as opposed to last year's rate of .216. Board continued discussion on a new 4-H building and how it would be paid for. There are funds in the inheritance tax fund. Suggestion was made to pay the full cost of the building out of inheritance and then budget additional funds each year to pay back the inheritance tax fund. Each year the county uses at least \$200,000.00 of inheritance tax funds to help with tax relief for county residents. Many different suggestions were made on how to fund the new building. Instead of budgeting the additional funds each year to pay back the inheritance tax fund, the state auditor's office suggested using less funds from the inheritance tax fund for tax relief each year. It would amount to the same tax rate. The board asked Engel to make the change, paying for the 4-H building out of inheritance tax fund. With that change, the tax rate dropped from .257 to .223. Jarecke also asked that she figure salary increases of 1.5% as opposed to a 3% increase to see what the difference is. Board will review again at the August 14th meeting.

In the State Fire Marshal's Code Review of the remodel of the Masonic Lodge Building for the Extension Office, it was stated that the construction plans do not bear the seal of a State Registered Engineer/Architect and may be subject to review by the Board of Engineers & Architects. The county received correspondence from the Board of Engineers & Architects regarding the fact that the construction documents did not bear the seal and it was necessary for the county to obtain a seal on the plans. An architect/engineer is scheduled to be in the area today and was willing to go over all the documents and inspect the building for a fee of \$3,200.00, if the county approved his fees. The board decided the \$3,200.00 fee may be less than a fine, if a fine was imposed, so it was agreed by the board to allow the \$3,200.00 fee to the architect/engineer to take care of the matter.

Design build selection committee for the new 4-H building met Monday evening, July 23, 2018. Committee members, Ralph Horacek and Dennis Jarecke gave the board an update from the meeting. Discussion was held on whether to proceed with the new building or not. Moved by Horacek and seconded by Jarecke to proceed with the plans on building a new 4-H building. Roll Call: AYES—Horacek, Jarecke, Nelson, Ditter, Cornwell; NAYS-Small; ABSENT-Voichoskie. Motion carried.

Board discussed the dispatcher consolidation with Boone County. Cornwell and Sheriff Bakewell met with the Boone County Sheriff. To consolidate Boone County is asking that Nance County pay one-half of their infrastructure costs, (\$120,910.00), which would be a one-time fee, plus pay for 2.5 employees (\$124,000.00) Bakewell feels this is way too much. Cornwell feels that they could get the infrastructure costs down, maybe taking into consideration county population or call volume. Boone County is having a board meeting tomorrow. Cornwell and Bakewell will attend the meeting. Cornwell asked for direction to discuss the consolidation costs to see if they could come down on some of the costs.

The Board reviewed and approved the Sheriff's Distress Warrant Report. Present is Ben Bakewell. The report stated that a total of \$11,677.36 plus interest of \$133.47 was collected from Distress Warrants #2016-00002 through #2016-00010.

Additionally Distress Warrant #2015-00003 was collected in the amount of \$242.98 plus interest of \$28.68.

Distress Warrant #2016-00001 in the amount of \$217.00 was not collected.

Resolution #18-10 is signed and available for public inspection at the office of the County Clerk.- Discussion held on reopening a closed road in East Newman township, tabled from the last meeting. Reopening this particular road would not connect it to any other traveled road, so the board decides to leave it closed. – The Dept. had a demo on a road drag last month. They feel the drag would greatly improve the grading of the roads in Nance County, but they felt the drag was too light. They suggested purchasing the heavier weight drag at a cost of \$28,985.00. Discussion held. Moved by Small and seconded by Horacek to purchase one of the heavier drags at a cost of \$28,985.00. Just need to order culverts & have JEO come out and set some alignments/flow line stakes, if needed. Board approved moving forward with the project and purchase of the culverts from Ace/Eaton Metals – Dept. would also like to move forward with project 205 west of Dave Sharman' residence. Project 63(132) east of Belgrade will be a spring project due to waiting on Core permits. Temporary employee was hired through August, it was decided by the board to keep him on for another 2 months.

Inventories of the Nance County offices were reviewed, approved and signed.

SuAnn Engel, budget preparer, presented copies of the essential budget forms for the board to review. As of now the levy has increased from 0.215610 last year to 0.224664 this year. Discussion held. Board instructs Engel to move forward with the publication of the budget hearing. Budget hearing set for September 11, 2018.

The design-build selection committee for the new fairgrounds building met with the selected design-builder B-D Construction representative, Brian Kearney, on August 27, 2018 to negotiate the building design. A contract will be prepared for the design-build. The committee members reported that the committee approved on the base cost of a 60' x 80' foot building (\$542,600.00) with the following additional options: build a 20' enclosed walkway from the new building to the existing building (\$20,950.00), remove one set of doors from the storage room and make the other set taller (-\$1,600.00), add 20' to the length of the building, making it a 60' x 100' building (\$96,025.00). With such options the cost of the building will be 657,975.00. Once approved, could possibly start on construction in 6 weeks. Also present is County Clerk, Danette Zarek and County Attorney, Rodney Wetovick. Chairman advised those present of the open meetings act and its posting in the Supervisor's Room.

Notice of the meeting was given thereof by publication in the Nance County Journal on September 5, 2018.

Notice of the meeting was given to the Board and a receipt of their acknowledgment is on file in the Clerk's office.

Moved by Voichoskie and seconded by Small to approve the agenda. Roll Call: AYES–Voichoskie, Horacek, Jarecke, Small, Nelson, Cornwell; NAYS–None; ABSENT-Ditter. Motion carried.

Moved by Small and seconded by Voichoskie to approve the minutes of the August 28, 2018 meeting. Roll Call: AYES–Small, Nelson, Voichoskie, Horacek, Jarecke, Cornwell; NAYS–None; ABSENT-Ditter. Motion carried.

Moved by Horacek and seconded by Jarecke to approve all claims submitted. Roll Call: AYES–Horacek, Jarecke, Small, Nelson, Voichoskie, Cornwell; NAYS-None; ABSENT-Ditter. Motion carried.

The Board reviewed and approved the Monthly Fee reports of the County Clerk in the amount of \$3,880.99; Clerk of the District Court in the amount of \$758.86; and County Sheriff in the amount of \$3,305.71.

Kelly Hale, treasurer of the Nance County Ag. Society, comes before the board to discuss the payment of the \$70,000.00 budgeted in the Ag. Society's 2017-2018 budget, targeted for the fairgrounds Events Center. Also present is SuAnn Engel, who is preparing the Ag. Society's 2018-2019 budget. She explains that the Ag. Society has been budgeting money to use on capital improvements the past few years and have been unable to do any capital improvements and this has put them in a bind as far as their budget for this year and coming years. It would be best for the Ag. Society to pay the county the \$70,000.00 that they budgeted, as soon as they have the money in the account. Hale expects the money to be in the account soon and will pay the county at that time. She then questioned the board about whether the new Events Center will be placed on a separate electric meter, so the electric bills can be kept separate from the existing building. Cornwell assured her that there will be a separate meter.

The board reviewed the Sheriff's inventory. Moved by Nelson and seconded by Voichoskie to approve and sign the Sheriff's inventory. Roll Call: AYES-Nelson, Voichoskie, Horacek, Jarecke, Small, Cornwell; NAYS-None; ABSENT- Ditter. Motion carried.

Tony Bernt, road foreman, gave updates in the road department. Also present is Tony Steensnes, second in charge. Tube project by Dustin Russell's is still under construction – All maintainers are out blading roads. They will be blading minimum maintenance roads as they blade their routes to get ready for harvest -S570th St. project is back under way. Will try to have it opened for harvest – Will start on Project 219 on Valley Road once they have completed other projects. They will have a temporary road installed while project is being completed - Department will be ready to start demo on the old 4-H building as soon as it is cleaned out. Board instructed that the restrooms are to be removed as well as the trees near the project - Council Creek has asked if the department will take over the maintenance of their minimum maintenance roads. There are approximately 7-9 miles - A concerned citizen questioned the weed spraying of ditches when ditches had water in them. Weed Supt. was using Rodeo (aquatic round-up) which is safe for spraying in water -Discussed whether to make the summer temporary employee a full-time. The employee has been maintaining partial routes of other maintainer operators, so that roads can be more regularly maintained. Cornwell feels he has been doing a good job. Jarecke does not want to add another employee to the payroll, increasing the budget. Bernt is questioned as to whether the cost of an additional employee is figured into the road budget for 2018-2019 and he states that it is. Moved by Nelson and seconded by Small to hire Tony Scheffler as a fulltime road employee. Roll Call: AYES-Nelson, Voichoskie, Horacek, Small, Cornwell; NAYS-Jarecke; ABSENT-Ditter. Motion carried.





Ben Bakewell, Sheriff, came before the board to present a proposed plan he has for the south side of the courthouse building. Also present it Denise Ziemba, emergency manager, and Cyndy Pilakowski, county attorney's secretary. Now that the county attorney's office is across the hall from the sheriff's office, Bakewell would like to make the south end of the courthouse a law enforcement area by building a wall north of the sheriff/county attorney office and keeping it locked. He enumerated problems with lack of space in the sheriff's office. He would like to use the current probation office for interviews, inmate holding, and datamaster. He also stated that this room would be available for attorneys to meet with clients on court days, which was also a concern. He is assuming the probation office is being moved into the planning and zoning office and the planning and zoning is planning on moving into the county attorney's old office. Cornwell asked Ziemba if she is interested in moving her office from the food pantry building to the courthouse. She states that she is comfortable with the office she has in the food pantry. Jarecke would like the board to have their own room to meet in, as they had prior to 2007. Horacek wondered if the vacant room off of the county attorney's office is available for office space. Pilakowski states that the way the offices are situated in the county attorney's office, they are needing that room for their filing cabinets. She says there is a spare desk in that room, that is available for anyone needing a desk. Cornwell asked Bakewell how soon he would like to see the wall built for his law enforcement area. He stated he did not expect it in this year's budget. The moving of the probation office and planning & zoning are approved as planned.

Board discusses the Design-Build Agreement and General Conditions Between Owner and Design-Builder. (Nance County and B-D Construction, Inc.) Wetovick has reviewed the agreement and found it complex. He would like to get clarification on some parts of the agreement. The agreement is a standard agreement for design-build situation and he does not feel that there is anything in the agreement that would prevent the board from signing, but he feels there should be a discussion with either Bryan Kearney, with B-D Construction or Dana Peterson, the performance criteria developer (PCD). Some board members do not want to delay the project any further. Water pressure for the building is discussed. Neither the design-builder nor the PCD have voiced concerns about the water pressure. New water lines will be installed to the building and, if necessary, a booster pump could be added. Moved by Jarecke and seconded by Horacek to approve signing the Design-Build Agreement and General Conditions Between Owner and Design-Builder, upon County Attorney discussing any concerns with Dana Peterson, PCD. Roll Call: AYES-Jarecke, Small, Nelson, Horacek, Cornwell; NAYS-Voichoskie; ABSENT-Ditter. Motion carried.

SuAnn Engel, Deputy Clerk, reported that the budget as published is the budget to be adopted for 2018-2019 fiscal year. Discussion was held. Tax rate for this year is .224664. Last year's tax rate was .216648. Jarecke questioned what the difference in tax dollars is from last year to this year. Engel states it is an additional \$74,000.00. Moved by Horacek and seconded by Small to adopt said budget. Jarecke states that he thinks the board is making a mistake increasing the budget by any amount. Roll Call: AYES-Horacek, Small, Cornwell; NAYS-Jarecke, Nelson, Voichoskie; ABSENT-Ditter. Motion fails. Further discussion held on where cuts could be made. Bakewell offers to cut \$40,000.00 out of his Sinking-Sheriff Vehicle Fund. He feels he could wait an additional year before replacing one of his units. Moved by Nelson and seconded by Voichoskie to reconsider the previous motion. Roll Call: AYES-Nelson, Voichoskie, Horacek, Small, Cornwell; NAYS-Jarecke; ABSENT-Ditter. Motion carried. Further discussion held. Moved by Jarecke and seconded by Voichoskie to adopt the budget at the same levy as it was set at last year, taking \$40,000.00 out of the Sinking-Sheriff Vehicle fund and \$34,000.00 out of the cash reserve. Roll Call: AYES-Jarecke, Small, Voichoskie, Cornwell; NAYS-Nelson, Horacek; ABSENT-Ditter. Motion carried.

RESOLUTION #18-14

WHEREAS, a proposed county budget for the fiscal year July 1, 2018 to June 30, 2019 prepared by the budget making authority, was transmitted to the county board on the 11th day of September, 2018.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Board of Supervisors of Nance County, Nebraska as follows:

Section 1. That the budget for the fiscal year July 1, 2018 to June 30, 2019 as categorically evidenced by the budget document be, and the same hereby is, adopted as the budget for Nance County for said fiscal year.

Section 2. That the offices, departments, activities and institutions herein named are hereby authorized to expend the amounts herein appropriated to them during the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2018 and ending June 30, 2019.





Section 3. That the income necessary to finance the appropriations made and expenditures authorized shall be provided out of the unencumbered cash balance in each fund, revenues other than taxation to be collected during the fiscal year in each fund, and tax levy requirements for each fund.

Moved by Jarecke and seconded by Voichoskie to adopt said resolution. Roll Call: AYES-Jarecke, Small, Voichoskie, Cornwell; NAYS-Nelson, Horacek. Motion carried.

Chairman closed the budget hearing.

Bakewell comes before the board to present the consolidation of dispatch information. Also present are Troy Cordle, 9-1-1 field coordinator with the State, and Denny Johnson, Boone County Sheriff. Bakewell states Nance County has 4 options with their dispatch: 1) consolidate with Hamilton County. They would charge \$150,000.00 year. At this time they have their hands full, having recently taken on Merrick County dispatch. 2) Region 26 quoted \$70,000.00 to consolidate. They already have 8 counties; they are a long ways away; and there are connectivity issues. 3) Boone County quoted \$108,000.00, which would pay for an additional 2.5 dispatch and they would take our inmates. There would be an additional \$30,000.00 one-time fee. 4) Platte County could be a future option. They hope to have their new communications center open by next July. Bakewell's concern with them is the Platte County Sheriff's office and Columbus Police department do not get along. If we continue to run our own dispatch we will need to hire and train one full-time and two part-time dispatchers. Our equipment is outdated and would cost \$400,000-\$500,000 to update to where we need to be. A spreadsheet was prepared showing the money the county could save by consolidating with Boone County. Spreadsheet shows in 8 years the county could save almost \$600,000.00 and in 15 years approximately \$1,400,000.00. Fire Department personnel are concerned with how their analogue radios are going to work with the sheriff's digital radios. At this time the sheriff's office can communicate with both analogue and digital, they just have to switch from one to the other and cannot communicate with the two at the same time. Boone County will also be able to communicate with the fire departments on analogue. Fire & rescue should work it in their budgets to update their equipment in the next few of years. Moved by Jarecke and seconded by Nelson to consolidate Nance County dispatch with Boone County dispatch, but continue to maintain the analogue system as necessary. Roll Call: AYES-Jarecke, Small, Nelson, Voichoskie, Horacek, Cornwell; NAYS-None; ABSENT-Ditter. Motion carried. The consolidation will go before the Boone County board on Monday. If approved, could be switched over by November or December. A concerned citizen voiced his concern that he does not feel this new system will work as well as our current system.

Option #1 also has a Q1 rating. Option #2 would have a Q3 rating, with an expectation to overtop every 6 years during a rain event. Option #3 has a Q4 rating and Option #4 has a Q11 rating. Another thing is the kitchen sink needs to be lowered to 42" to be handicap accessible. Once the verifications and/or changes have been made it will need to be reinspected.

Sheriff, Ben Bakewell, reports that NIRMA will cover all the expenses of the generator failure. The findings from the investigation found no man error in operating the generator at the time of the failure. The battery backup may be able to be fixed instead of purchasing a new one for \$10,000.00. The backup would last approximately 2 hours in the event of a power outage. He sees no need to replace the generator if we have the backup working.

Wetovick discusses the dispatch contract between Nance and Merrick counties. He followed the contract that Merrick and Hamilton counties has in place. The contract will be for \$108,265.00/year. Boone County is asking that the contract run for 3 years. Prior to Nance County turning over their 9-1-1 funds, we will try to use those funds to supplement our sheriff's office, as the funds were earned while we were running our own dispatch center.

Also discussed a severance package for the two dispatchers who have agreed to stay on with the county until the switch over occurs. Employees have asked for an additional two months pay, including the cost of health insurance. The board does not have a problem with such a severance package.

Cyndy Pilakowski came before the board to request a budget of \$500.00 for County Government Day. County Government day is tentatively set for Thursday, November 1st. The National Guard pays for the noon meal for all the students and we receive donations from various businesses to help out also. Moved by Nelson

Services included: Education of the dangers of tobacco and alcohol to 5th graders at Fullerton & Twin Rivers schools; conduction of student health screenings; conducted disease investigations on Nance County residents; conduct surveys of all schools for influenza like illnesses; referrals for high lead levels in children; distribution of radon kits; also provided cold weather kits & blankets to Fullerton Food Pantry.

9:20 Rodney Wetovick, County Attorney, and Cyndy Pilakowski are present.

Pilakowski has been working on this year's County Government Day. In the past the National Guard has paid for the students' lunches for that day. She received an email Monday stating that their budget has been cut and they can no longer provide for the lunches. She asked the board if they wanted to proceed with the County Government Day or cancel it due to the National Guard being unable to provide the students' lunches. Board would like her to proceed with County Government Day.

Wetovick updated the board on the extension office compliances for the State Board of Engineers. Corrections are being made and the board of engineers has agreed to an extension to November 21st.

Public defenders contract with John Morgan is discussed. John Morgan will be taking over as Boone County Attorney in January, 2019. Wetovick will check with Morgan to see how long he plans on fulfilling the contract. Once the county knows a date, they could then advertise for an attorney to fill the remainder of the contract.

Tony Bernt, road foreman, gave updates in the road department. Continue to work on roads for harvest traffic. Running new drag to save hours on motor graders. He feels the drag has helped retrieve gravel and get the roads back into shape faster — Dirt work at fairgrounds is finished. The rented roller will be taken back to Norfolk today — Will begin working on sluff offs now to get them fixed before winter. There are eight of these sluff offs — Dave has been running the south maintainer route and Mike is now on dirt crew. Seems to be working well. He has received calls complementing Dave on his work — Will also be working on cleaning out some plugged culverts that they discovered this summer — Once these projects are completed, they will be back to shredding trees — He was asked if they have had to mow any ditches. He said there are a few, but they have been too busy to mow right now.



SuAnn Engel, deputy clerk, comes before the board to get direction on what the board would like to look at as far as health insurance options. There has been a 6% increase in the United Health Care premiums. One option suggested is to have the county pay 100% of a single premium and the employees wishing to cover their spouse/children/family would have to pay the additional premium. Currently the county pays a percentage of employee, employee/spouse, employee/children and family. Another option is to split the 6% increase with the employee and continue to pay a percentage of the spouse/children/or family. Horacek suggested increasing the cash in lieu of insurance from \$217.00/month to \$400.00/month. It was questioned as to what the options are as far as increasing the deductible. The current plan has a \$1,000.00 deductible. Engel did not have that information. Engel wondered if it would be an option to pay each employee \$1,000.00/month to use to purchase their own insurance. With elected officials and deputies salaries being set by resolution, Wetovick did not know if that would be appropriate. Engel said she will work up these options and maybe come up with one or two others, if they were okay with that. Board agreed.

Board discussed how they wanted to handle the use of the conference room at the new extension building. Does the county want to let businesses use the room, or would they like to keep it open to educational & non-profit only? If the county charges rent, the building would become non-exempt, but donations could be accepted. The board decided that until the new building at the fairgrounds is completed, they will allow businesses to use the room, but after that they will ask the businesses to use the events building. There will be a system put in place for people to set up the dates and submit the fees. County would like to continue to allow educational/non-profits to use the extension conference room. Discussed having Wetovick prepare an agreement, where the group using the facilities would be liable for any damages they may cause to the extension conference room.

The zoning/economic development has moved into the old county attorney's office, making that room open for the probation office. Probation employees came last week to move their furniture/equipment into the room. They also called Applied Connective to come set them up for their computers/printer/phone. Clerk's office questioned Applied Connective as to the work they were to complete. They set up the office to allow the probation the access that was necessary to perform their work. They also had plans to do additional work, but it was decided to ask for estimates prior to them completing any additional work. Two estimates were received; one for \$825.96 and a second one for \$1,045.96. Discussion held. Board decided it was not necessary to have the additional work done if probation has what is necessary for them to run their office.

Contract shall run for three years, at which time the parties agree to negotiate for the continuation of the dispatching services. Wetovick went over additional terms of the agreement with the board. He also provided an alternate with Blue Cross/Blue Shield for an HSA plan (8.20% decrease from current HSA plan) and a Copay plan (21.02% increase from current Copay plan), which would average out to be a 12.57 % increase from the current health plans. These two plans are the most comparable to the plans the county currently has. Using the new premiums from the UHC plans, Engel presented several options to the board, including Option 2 in which the county would pick up the increase and a change being made to the HSA with the county share being lowered to the same amount as the county's share on the Copay plan. And Option 4 in which the county and employee would share the increase (3.12%) and the same change being made to the HSA. Discussion held. Moved by Nelson and seconded by Small to go with option #2. A bid has also been received from Sharples Heating and Cooling to correct the air exchange issue and restroom ventilation. Bid is for \$3,950.00. He also has an email from the engineer on the HVAC side of the remediation and he approves the air exchange corrections proposed by Sharples and will recommend that the insulation be approved as installed.

Denise Ziemba and Ron Sims are present to discuss lighting and ceiling in the food pantry and emergency manager rooms in the road building. They received a verbal bid of \$3,500.00 from Brandon Harder to replace the ballasts in the current lighting fixtures to adapt LED lights. Board thought this bid was a bit high and asked that they have him give a written bid with costs itemized. It has also been brought to their attention that the ceiling tiles are old and falling apart. Also the drywall installed above the lights was never finished and is falling down. It was suggested to put in a drop ceiling and new light fixtures. Board also asked that they check to see what kind of insulation is in these rooms. Board asked Ziemba and Sims to come to next meeting with costs.

The second meeting in December falls on Christmas. Discussion held on when to hold this meeting. It was decided that the December 25th meeting be moved to December 26, 2018.
