Finishing up 2024 FEMA project on N 510 and Nest Road. Have 3 more 2024 FEMA projects to finish before October. Once FEMA projects completed will work on digging ditches and maintenance work. Tree shredding starts September 1st. One road member will be assisting Weed Superintendent with using tree mister.

Brett Houtby presents with concerns of ditches that need dug out, roads that need gravel and culverts that are plugged. Discussion held.

SIGNING OF THE COUNTY ANNUAL CERTIFICATION OF PROGRAM COMPLIANCE 2026
